Ongoing Initiatives

- New build at Ardenslate, Dunoon 24 units, expected completion January 2013.
- Garden in Bloom competition.
- Progress with purchase of property for ACHA's offices at Ladeside Place, Rothesay.
- Broxwood Place and Douglas Gardens, Dunoon roof and roughcast work nearing completion.



Ongoing Initiatives

- Glebe Terrace, Rothesay and Ardenslate, Dunoon roof and roughcast work complete on properties solely owned by ACHA.
- Refurbishment work on site at Regent and Salisbury Terrace, Dunoon.

Ongoing Initiatives (continued)

- ACHA has continued with the Welfare Rights Service; income to date for tenants, £3.2million.
- 445 tenants in Bute and Cowal have benefited by £529,000 through ACHA's Welfare Rights Service.
- Welfare reform; 69 ACHA tenants in Bute and 118 ACHA tenants in Cowal will be affected by the "bedroom tax".



Argyll Homes for All

- ACHA's maintenance subsidiary will also carry out non charitable activities
- Final business case to go to ACHA's Board 13th December 2012
- From April 1st 2013 it will provide in house maintenance service across all of Argyll and Bute
- It will employ 44 people and have an initial turnover of £3.2million
- From the third year it is hoped to provide services to third parties



Issues and Wider Update

- The introduction of Universal Credit, Welfare Reform and the Bedroom Tax
- Huge pressure on insurance premiums
- Consultation closed on future of the Right to Buy
- How we make best use of the Rural Housing Development fund
- Three year housing investment programme introduced
- The new Scottish Social Housing Charter comes in to place from 2013
