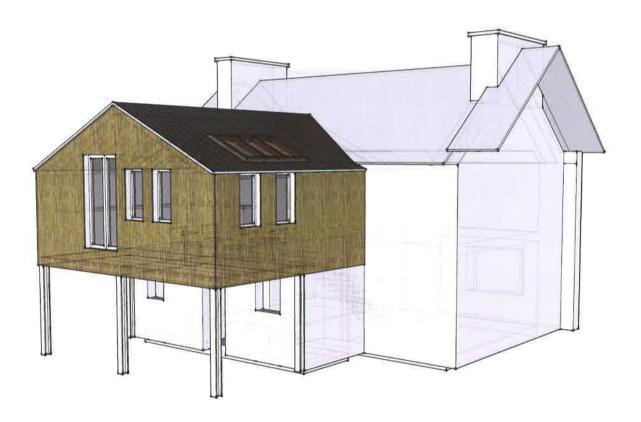

The following design statement is submitted in support of our application for Planning Permission to remove an existing kitchen extension and replace with a slightly larger kitchen/dining room extension.



### Description of Proposed Development

The proposal is for a single room extension to the rear of a dwelling house, currently there is a small two storey extension in place, it is proposed to demolish the top storey of this extension and extend outward at the upper storey, leaving the original lower storey in place. The proposed extension is to have the same eaves level and ridge line of the existing extension.



### Planning/Design considerations

As the site lies within the designated conservation area, the intention of the proposed extension is to be visually separated from the traditional fisherman's cottage by its use of materials. The Local Planning policy LP ENV 14 advises:

"New development within these areas and on sites forming part of their settings must be of the highest quality, respect and enhance the architectural and other special qualities that give rise to their actual or proposed designation"

With this proposal there is a deliberate use of materials which intend to enhance the architectural qualities of the original building by clearly illustrating what the massing, materials and design of the original part of the house is in contrast to the new.

This approach to design is common where extensions are made to historic/listed buildings as it allows the original building to stand apart from later additions — there are some (more prominent) examples within the Tobermory conservation area where large scale extensions have been built with finishes to match the historic building, this makes it very unclear as to what is original and what is a later addition; undermining the significance and character of the original dwellings.

The Argyll and Bute sustainable design guide (Working with Argyll and Bute's built heritage) also encourages this approach to design especially for small extensions – for this type of extensions, the guidance encourages the use of roof and wall materials/details which are clearly different from the original building and discourages "look alike" materials.

Furthermore, the site is well hidden behind a newly constructed extension to 1 Argyll Terrace and the extension will only offer a glimpse of the materials, which, once weathered will be a subtle addition to the house.

The proposed pallet of materials has an emphasis on sustainability. The materials used will be of superior quality using corrugated profiled metal roofing materials (slate grey), traditional timber windows with a vertical emphasis, coupled with traditional larch detailing to the external walls, all of which reflect the true West Highland vernacular.

#### Conclusions

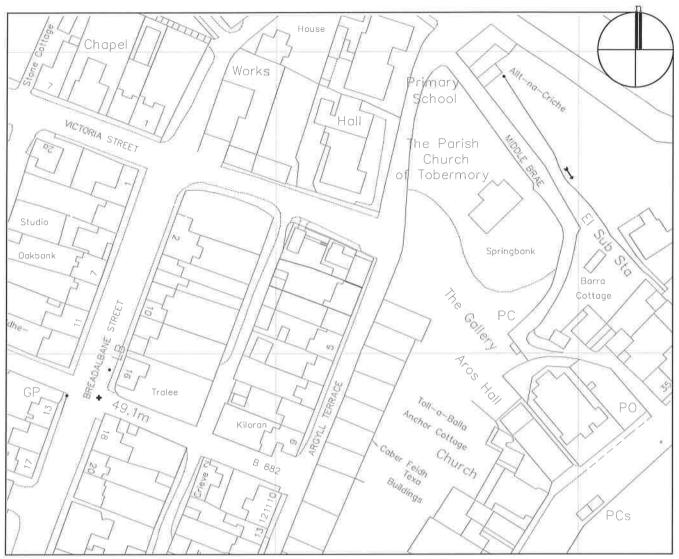
The above examples clearly illustrate that the materials chosen for the proposal are very common within the designated conservation area, especially on rear extensions; this application does not propose any changes to the prominent street elevation of the house, only alterations to the (mostly) concealed rear. It is proposed to use materials prominent within the conservation area, and wider settlement area, which contrast the historic fabric of the original building.

In addition to the above examples, it is noted that application 11/01336/PP features an extension with timber cladding at first floor level and was approved 21 Sept 2011.

Whilst preparing this application it brought to my attention the myriad of external wall and roof material choices that are evident throughout the conservation village of Tobermory. The roofing materials range from Spanish, Welsh, Scottish and Cumbrian slates, a myriad of concrete tiles, asbestos tiles and sheeting, onduline sheeting, corrugated sheeting sinusoidal and box profiles. This variation is also evident in the external wall finishes, ranging from block, stone, render, wet dash, larch, timber v'd lining, glass and also corrugated sheet materials.

I therefore took cognisance of all these material choices and thought it best to comply with Argyll and Bute guidance. This is ultimately why the building materials choices were made to concur with what you are trying to achieve for a better, built environment.

I trust that Argyll and Bute Council will recognise all of what has been articulated above and have no hesitation in recommending this application for approval.
