With reference the proposed development we would like you to consider all the objections involved with this matter.

This development first hit the planning stage 05 July 2013 reference 13/01490/PP . There was a large number of objections to this application which seemed to fall on deaf ears.

The developer then withdrew the 4 holiday letting units from the above application. He was then granted planning permission for just the bistro, much to our surprise considering the number of objections on the environmental impact of developing this site.

We feel that the environmental impact of such a development has very much been ignored. This site has an abundance of breeding birds and otters, on and around it. The added impact of the proposed 4 Holiday Lets will be devastating to the area. As well as disregard to the local plan set out by Argyll and Bute Planning regarding environmental impact and visual impact.
