6.	BUDGET – COUNCIL AND PARTNERS OVERVIEW OF BUDGET POSITION FOR 2010-2011	
6.	a) Argyll and Bute Council - Bruce West gave an overview of the Council Budget. A 3 year programme of Service Reviews has been started with an initial target saving of 15% for each review. For years 2011/12 and 2012/13 there is a reduction in real terms of 12% with a forecast in demand growth of 2% - giving a £13M funding gap. b) NHS – The NHS are looking for potential savings of £14M, they are currently looking at a £4.9M deficit. The current redesign programme is looking at providing new, better ways of delivering care, not cutting services. It was noted that Partnership working is vitally important and it is hoped that shortly there will be a programme for Partnership working during the next years. c) Strathclyde Police – Strathclyde Police are looking at a deficit of between £15M - £35M over the next 2 years. They are currently reviewing the way services are provided by looking at various elements including accommodation, management structure and procurement. The intention is that front line services remain at the current level but the changes come from back line services and looking at how services can be provided jointly with other Partners. d) Strathclyde Fire and Rescue – Next year's budget is not set as yet but it is anticipated there will be cuts in real terms and possible changes to areas, management structure and accommodation. e) HIE – Next year's budget is not set as yet but a tight settlement is expected. A voluntary redundancy scheme has been announced with anticipated financial saving of 15% – 30% this is a reduction of 30 – 40 staff. Efficiency saving are also being looked at within the backdrop of their commitment to deliver new projects within Argyll.	
	is follows the academic year not the fiscal year so at this moment the funding level is unknown. It has been announced that there will be an 8% cut year on year over the next two years which can be absorbed by efficiency savings, however, if the funding moves to Lochaber this could in effect remove 10%-12% of funding.  g) SPT – The budget is the same as last year. There is a recruitment freeze on except for safety critical posts and a voluntary redundancy scheme where it's expected 25 – 30 posts will be removed. Some fares have been increased,	

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	energy efficiency measures have been introduced and where necessary services cut, concessionary travel schemes are being reviewed and looking at joint service provisions.  h) SEARS – The budget is reducing year on year, expecting running costs to be reduced by 2.5% - 3.5% each year.  The Partners discussed asset management, shared services, joined up service provision, information sharing and the importance of looking at the collective impact on our communities. Sally Loudon is due to give a presentation to the Convention of Highlands and Islands in April on Shared Services.
