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Title: Social Affairs Thematic CPP Group

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 The fourth Social Affairs Thematic CPP Group meeting was held on 9 August 2010.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Note progress in the development of the Social Affairs Thematic CPP scorecard.
- 2.2 Note that the group agreed to sign the proposed partnership agreement subject to some amendments.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The group considered a report providing an update on progress of the performance management arrangements for the Social Affairs Thematic CPP Group.

The Thematic Lead Officer also reported on background work currently being undertaken by the Council in respect of changes to the Pyramid system which will be rolled out over the next 2 to 3 weeks.

The group noted the details of these reports and agreed some changes to the scorecard which is likely to be further amended following feedback from the recent 'Forward Together' events.

- 3.2 The group considered a report outlining details of the integration of strategic partnerships and a proposed partnership agreement and agreed to sign the agreement subject to a couple of minor amendments.
- 3.3 The group noted progress on the pilot currently being undertaken to enable Partners to access the Council's performance management system, Pyramid and that 3 Argyll and Bute CHP representatives had access to it.

- 3.4** The group considered a report from NHS Highland which highlighted the type of work being undertaken by the Highland Improvement Planning and Performance Group (HIPAG) and agreed to request that HIPAG identify a measure which could be included in the groups' scorecard.

4. CONCLUSION

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Update report on MAKI Local Area Community Planning Group

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report summarises the further progress which the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands Local Area Community Planning Group (LACPG) has made in developing the group.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 That the Management Committee note the progress which the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands Local Area Community Planning Group has made in developing the group.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The LACPG met on 1 September 2010 in the Town Hall, Campbeltown with good representation from across the core partners.
- 3.2 The group received presentations on the new vision for the CPP and several comments were noted by Jane Fowler.
- 3.3 The workshop on the Council budget consultation was not very successful in that the members of the group felt that they required more of the detail of the proposals before they would be able to comment. The group agreed that there should be a specific workshop on the Councils Budget proposals at the next MAKI Forward Together Seminar in October.
- 3.4 The group received a presentation on the Adult Learning Disability Consultation from Douglas Boynton and Pamela MacLeod.
- 3.5 The group received a presentation on the Mental Health Redesign from David Pectin NHS Highland.
- 3.6 The group were advised that the second MAKI Forward Together Seminar would take place on Saturday 30 October at a venue still to be arranged.
- 3.7 Ch Insp Baillie gave a presentation on the Strathclyde Police Community Policing Plans for the three wards within MAKI.
- 3.8 The group reports from Eileen Wilson on the Community Engagement Strategy, the partnership agreement and the consultation diary.

- 3.9** The group received a presentation from George Dean of Argyll Renewables Communities Consortium and it was suggested that consideration be given for a specific workshop on the development of renewable energy within MAKI at the next MAKI Forward Together Seminar in October.

4. CONCLUSION

- 4.1** There remains a real enthusiasm within the group for CP and the group has a better understanding of its role within the CPP process. It was again highlighted in several of the discussions for the need for better communication between and amongst the partners.

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
