THE ARGYLL AND BUTE COUNCIL
ROUTES C57 GLENBRANTER BACK ROAD AND U12 SUCCOTH ROAD
(30MPH AND 20MPH SPEED LIMIT)
(AMMENDMENT) ORDER 200\_

The above order was proposed in 2008 to provide safer routes to school (Strachur Primary School) and local amenities (sports playing field). This was to link up the school and playing field to the residential areas on both sides of the A815. At present the route from Primary school to playing fields starts in a 60mph zone, enters a40mph zone at the A815 junction, 30mph zone till just beyond road serving Forest View and back into 60 mph before reaching the gate to the playing field. The proposal would start in a 20mph, then 30mph, then 40mph and be in a 30mph at the gate. The extent of the 30mph on the southern end of the road was determined by the dwellings both existing and proposed effectively up to the boundary with the area controlled by Loch Lomand and Trosscahs National Park.

The extent of the order was to provide:

- C57 30mph speed restriction from northern junction with A815 in a southern direction for a
  distance of some 923 metres; excluding 330 metres or thereby leading up to and including
  the frontage of Strachur Primary School for which a mandatory 20mph speed restriction is
  sought.
- 2. U12 extending the existing 30mph speed restriction some 336 metres initially in north eastern direction and then in south eastern.

Consultations 1 and 2 were carried out. List of Consultees APP1
2no. letters of support were received: i/ Strathclyde Police APP2

ii/ Strachur and District Community Council APP3.

On advertising the Order 2no. letters of objection were received with the Consultation Period i/ Mrs Mooney APP4
ii/ Mr Mooney APP5

A meeting was set up to discuss their concerns with a representative of the Network Manager East, Mr P Farrell. As a result of the meeting with both of the above a letter was sent out detailing the reason for the introduction of the proposed speed limits and responses to the concerns stated on their letters of objection.APP6

Both Mrs and Mr Mooney indicated by letter that they wished their objections to be upheld which has resulted in this hearing being organised. APP7 and APP8 respectively.





Notice of proposed speed restrictions on C57 Glenbranter back road and Succoth road

These roads are small country roads, lined with a few houses, forming part of the Cowal Way. A change in status from unrestricted to restricted will make it far easier for housebuilding and other developments to proceed - for instance by removing some of the planning obstacles for new driveways and access roads.

Whilst a 20mph speed limit in the area surrounding the primary school is appropriate for safety reasons, restrictions elsewhere seem somewhat redundant. It is simply not possible to drive at speeds in excess of 30 or 40mph in any event given the nature of these narrow, winding roads.

A more appropriate solution to any perceived problems with these roads, beyond the school area, would be to erect signage to reflect the roads' status as single-track roads, and to add passing places where required.

That would have the dual benefit of securing both the earliety of road-users and the character of these local roads; as opposed to apposing speed restrictions which may well end up becoming shortcuts for developments that are not in keeping with the village character nor the current Strachur & District Community Action Plan. Reference is made to the priorities stated in that Plan to move away from building large, expensive houses which neither blend into the landscape nor meet local housing need. Development must not continue in the current vein of ignoring the surrounding environment (including, for example, unnecessary tree-cutting and damage to road surface drainage).

I look forward to being kept appraised of the progress of this notice.

Dear Sir/Madam,

Both roads are single track country roads which have not changed materially since they were surveyed in the early 1800. Their rural character led to them being incorporated in the Cowal Way.

We do not object to the 20mph Zone near the school. However the 30mph Zoning proposal up to the boundary of the National Park off no material benefit apart from facilitating those whose wishes are to change the rural character of the road in favour of a Stracker Village extension with grand houses on prominent sites, affording views to no residents (who already have unnecessarily lopped hedgerows & felled a substantial number of native trees) in favour of "in your face" driveways and treeless gardens.

The environmentally damaging impact of removing trees for housing (land north of Oakbank) and the rurally damaging effects of houses which stand out from a natural setting (new houses at the standard of Elenbranter bock road) surely demands that the Council and its subordinate bodies do whotever they can to reduthese trends in Javour of an approach more balanced than that of landowners falling over themselves to sell plots of land for (certain in the current economic climate) very inflated prices. To my conee. We can add the real possibility of new houses on these roads ly empty in the Juture due to the drastic economic climate

Let the roads be classified as "single track" (they are not suitable in terms of width & surface drainage for large vehicles & sloping driveways [c.f. the current road state around Oakbank, south of Tombu Cottage), and have appropriate passing places.

### THE ARGYLL AND BUTE COUNCIL (ROUTE C57 GLENBRANTER BACK ROAD AND U12 SUCCOTH ROAD) (30MPH AND PART TIME 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 200

I refer to your letter received which objected to the introduction of the above speed restrictions.

It is also noted that on a subsequent meeting on Tuesday 18th November with Mr P Farrell the concerns relating to the potential development of the southern section of Glenbranter Back Road were discussed.

The Local Area Plan has approved infill development on this section of carriageway. The issues raised to the 30mph speed limit are considered to be planning issues. The introduction of the proposed speed limits are to improve the safety for all road users including yourself and persons travelling to and from the nearby school.
