4. Detail

Lomond School

We currently have six graduates supporting an Imagineering Project - Encouraging young primary children to be interested in Engineering.

Hermitage Academy

Recently two Apprentices supported the Academy in facilitating

workshops over the course of the day encouraging and promoting engineering and the opportunities available to them at Babcock.

Our Hotel & Catering Staff cover the Academy's "Healthy Eating Days" where our chefs go along and teach pupils how to produced health dishes.

A number of employees attend their Careers Days and Skills days. This can take the form of coaching on CV preparation, holding mock interviews, developing their communications, teamworking, teambuilding skills etc. Helping with the "softer" skills.

Work Experience

Over the course of the year, Babcock support a number of pupils in Work experience, these experiences cover apprentices and graduates in engineering, working in the kitchens, gaining experience in Graphic Design and Printing, PR & Communications which all assists the young people in making decision on their career paths.

Various Schools in the area

Mixture of apprentices and managers have been visiting career fairs to promote engineering and opportunities at Babcock.

Supporting Primary Engineer Awards, Apprentices, Engineers and Managers were out at schools judging the projects for the pupils to move to the next stage of the competition.

Community Projects

Ten Apprentices supported a project tasked to them by Head of Production - the apprentices had to build a chair for a young disabled girl to allow her to compete in discus throwing and club throwing. This was designed to a standard specification. Recently had to be modified by the team in line with further specification modifications. After testing and a season of use, the young lady required changes to be made and delighted with the result.

Another group of Apprentices worked with Helensburgh Sailing Club this time building a launching trolley to assist disabled persons in sailing. This was presented at the Helensburgh Sailing Centre and again the users were delighted.

CHAS - Robin House – We assist where possible at their Annual Open Day.

Fair in the Square – We provide catering at this annual event in the form of a barbeque.
