




Public Reassurance Preconditions

Public Reassurance Model


8 Stage Process

- 1 **Research -** what we already know
- **2** Engage with the community
- **3** Audit report on stages 1& 2
- **4 S**can signal crimes & visual audits
- 5 Select 3 priorities for action
- 6 Undertake joint problem solving
- 7 **Review -** *identify best practice*
- 8 Establish continuous improvement


























WHY IT WORKS
