### Investment spend to date

- The spend to date in Bute and Cowal since the Association was formed amounts to approximately £34.4million
- 8502 elements of work.
- Challenge with a growing number of referrals for adaptations with a decreasing budget





#### Windows and doors

 We are carrying out an extensive programme of window and door replacements across Bute and Cowal with programmes in Rothesay, Kirn, Port Riddell, Dunoon, Tighnabruaich, Lochgoilhead, Cairndow and Strachur.





#### Kitchens and bathrooms

 Having invested heavily in the previous programmes, there is limited spend in this area this financial year.





### Heating and rewire

- We are installing new energy efficient heating systems to meet the Scottish Government Energy Efficient standard EESSH.
- We are installing new energy efficient heating systems to 77 homes this year across Dunoon, Ardentinny, Tighnabruaich, Lochgoilhead, Cairndow and Rothesay



### Roof and Roughcast

- The roof and roughcast programme is driven by our desire to meet EESSH and SHQS and to provide our tenants with warmer homes that cost less to heat.
- We have programmes installing new external wall insulation across Dunoon, Tighnabruaich, Rothesay and Colintraive.
- With new roofs being installed in Rothesay, Dunoon and Tighnabruaich.

- These works improve the energy efficiency of our homes to make the houses warmer and cheaper to heat.
- We have carried out extensive programmes in Bute and Cowal in previous years.

## Responsive Repairs and Cyclical Maintenance

- ACHA spend over £1.1 million per year carrying out repairs and maintenance in Bute and Cowal
- This work is carried out by Argyll Homes for All





#### ACHA stock restructure in Bute and Cowal

- 32 flats recently demolished at Watson Place,
   Ardbeg due to no demand to live in them
- Socially useful options for the cleared site to be considered
- Ongoing work to relocate 3 tenants at Longhill Terrace, Ballochgoy to allow the properties to be sold. Reluctance of private owner neighbours to buy-in to upgrade work
- Further demolition planned for 16 properties at Columshill Higher Terrace and Columshill Lower Terrace





#### ACHA stock restructure in Bute and Cowal

 Current consultation with our tenants in Eton Avenue, Dunoon, and elected Members, on a proposal to demolish 36 bedsits and one bedroom flats and replace them with 8 new 2 and 3 bedroom properties, along with an office for ACHA and AHFA staff





#### ACHA stock restructure in Bute and Cowal







- £85,300 investment in fire sprinkler systems for our sheltered housing complexes at Wallace Court, Sandbank and Cragroy, Port Riddell.
- ACHA's Board approved the lease of the Torlochan Travelling Persons site to Dunoon Small Animal Rescue
- ACHA's 10 10 10 initiative; 8 schools in Argyll and Bute have benefited this year, including Innellan, Toward and Strone Primary Schools who all receive £1,000 from this year's awards



- ACHA's Community Action Fund; Kilfinan Community Forest and Comann nam Parant Comphall have received donations this year
- ACHA's second Tenants' Conference will be held on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> February 2019
- ACHA's Your Voice Scrutiny Group won Most Inspiring Scrutiny Newcomer Award at the Tenants Information Service (TIS) annual awards
- Universal Credit was rolled out in Argyll and Bute on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2018





- Volunteer recruitment exercise currently underway for volunteers to serve on ACHA's Board and 4 Area Committees
- ACHA currently house 13 Syrian refugee families on Bute with another family due to arrive mid-December
