I am writing in support of the appeal which has been submitted for the planning application for

The Old Coach House, Ellenabeich, ref: 18/00355/PP.

I understand that permission for the project has been granted subject to the boundary

wall and garage being block built and faced in stone/slate. Having wandered

around the village I can't see any garages that have a slate finish - they are all white

rendered so stipulating that the garage be slate finished is not in keeping with the

village. I am aware that the local conservation plan states that where a wall is built

adjoining another wall or building, the new wall must have the same finish as the old one.

I understand this was the reason for the Seafari wall around their fuel store

having to be built with a slate finish - because it joined onto an old slate wall. The

boundary wall in this planning application is to join onto a white rendered building so going by

the conservation area guidelines it should therefore be faced with white render. Why

are the council insisting it should be stone finished? If the wall was to be white

rendered it would look good and in keeping with its surroundings.
