COUNCIL OPERATED FERRIES – POTENTIAL TRANSFER TO TRANSPORT SCOTLAND

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 5.4 HR Should the ferry transfer take place, there will be staffing (including TUPE) implications which will need to be dealt with in line with Council policy and procedure.

- 5.6 Risk There is a risk to existing core Council services should the ongoing subsidy of lifeline ferry services continue to be made.
