DETAILS OF VARIATIONS SOUGHT:-

The applicant wishes to vary the licence as follows:-

Change of layout plan to include an external area.

LSO: The premises were visited on 10th November 2016 and the application discussed with the applicant. Licensing Standards has no objections to this application and the following is for consideration.

Photographs depicting the premises and proposed outdoor drinking area have been submitted with this report.

This application is to introduce outdoor drinking into the operating plan including the submission of an updated layout plan showing the area (in hatched green) to the front of the premises (public footpath) where benches will be positioned to allow outdoor drinking, snacks and non-alcoholic beverages. In addition, the terms for children and young persons to access is to include the outdoor drinking area.

The Argyll and Bute Council Café Culture Policy document advises the desirability that licensed outdoor drinking areas should be suitably marked out and the Board may wish to consider the area being clearly delineated so that patrons and the public are fully aware of the parameters.

Outdoor Drinking

The Board may wish to impose the usual curfews of 2200 hours for adults and 2000 hours for children and young persons and update the operating plan accordingly.

- 1) This is an application which was first brought before the Board in November 2016.
