The Glass Barn Café is a café/restaurant forming part of Sgriob-ruadh Farm in a rural setting where Isle of Mull Cheese is produced. Customers will have the opportunity to eat in or take away, including both food and beverage. Customers will also be able to take part in tours of the farm and both sample and purchase the cheese and spirits produced on the premises.

Operating Plan

Question 1

Alcohol will be sold for on and off consumption.

Questions 2 & 3

On sales – 1000 to 2200 Sunday to Thursday and 1000 to Midnight Friday and Saturday

Off Sales – 1000 to 2200 Monday to Sunday

Board policy stipulates a start time of 1100 for on sales premises unless the applicant can show a need for a 1000 start.

No Seasonal Variation requested.

Question 5

The applicant proposes the following allowable activities on the premises –

Restaurant facilities; recorded music; live performance and outdoor drinking.

The applicant has not requested any activities outwith core licensing hours, but has included the following statement in the box beneath the allowable activities columns. I suggest this statement is not required to be recorded on the operating plan –

“The venue is currently an existing café. In addition to this we are building a distillery.

The future vision is that

We will sell our product open or unopened from this site

We would like the opportunity to hold weddings and provide licensed drinks.

We would like to have the opportunity to offer meals and provide licensed drinks

We would like to have the opportunity to have artist come up and play music as part of Mull music festival and other art events

We will play the radio or Spotify in the venue

We will have tours of our distillery”

Question 5(f)

The Board may wish to impose the standard curfew for outdoor drinking of 2200 for persons aged 18 years and over and 2000 for children and young persons.

Question 6

Applicant's proposed wording for children and young persons access –

Terms

Children or young persons will be allowed to access to the distillery in the company of an adult aged 18 years or over.

Children will be allowed access to the cafe and farm shop as long in the company of an adult aged 18 years or over.

Young persons will be allowed in the cafe and farm shop.

Ages

Children of all ages (birth to 15 years)

Young persons (aged 16 & 17 years)

Times

Children and young persons will be allowed entry between 10am and 10pm Sunday to Thursday, 10am to 12am Friday and Saturday.

Parts

All public parts of the premises.

The Board may wish to consider this standardised wording –

Terms

Children or young persons will be allowed to access to the distillery in the company of a responsible person aged 18 years or over. Children will be allowed access to the cafe and farm shop in the company of a responsible person aged 18 years or over. Young persons will be allowed unaccompanied in the cafe and farm shop.

Ages

Children of all ages [birth to 15 years]

Young persons [16 & 17 years]

Times

Children and young persons will be allowed entry indoors until 2200 and outdoors until 2000.

(This statement is in line with Board policy).

Parts

All public parts of the premises.
