New Construction & Engineering Centre in Campbeltown – The UHI Argyll Brewster
Centre was funded by the Highland's and Islands Enterprise (HIE), UHI Argyll's own
resources and a donation of £46,590 from the Brewster Legacy for the purpose of
advancing education within the community and to assist those who may not have
benefitted from mainstream formal education and faced challenges in accessing
further education.

The official opening of the centre took place at MACC Business Park's 10th Anniversary Open Day on Saturday 14 May 2022. Argyll and Bute MSP Jenni Minto officially opened the facility with a ribbon cutting ceremony.
