CEMETERY MAINTENANCE AND PROVISION

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This is a follow up report to a Cemetery Asset report considered by the Environment, Development and Infrastructure Committee in March this year which can be viewed here (item 8): <u>Agenda for Environment</u>, <u>Development and</u> <u>Infrastructure Committee on Thursday</u>, <u>2 March 2023</u>, <u>10:30 am - Argyll and</u> Bute Council (argyll-bute.gov.uk)
- 1.2 This covering report highlights the relevant information for the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands Area Committee.

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

3.0 DETAIL

3.1 The Environment, Development and Infrastructure Committee report provides comprehensive information regarding cemetery provision across the whole council area. The summary table below details lairs which are closed, active and those with less than 5 years capacity in the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and the Islands area.

- 3.2 There was previously issues with capacity at Kilkerran Cemetery reported in the 2019 EDI update paper. Due to revised counting, which is now based on the previous year's lairs sold and the fact that we have introduced a stop on pre-sale of lairs at Kilkerran, we now have capacity of just over 7 years. However, work carried out to try and find a solution to expand or identify another area for a cemetery in Campbeltown has proven very challenging and time consuming due to the ground issues as well as identification of other suitable sites. Officers are still progressing with this.
- 3.3 At the March EDI Committee, it was agreed that where cemeteries are reaching capacity of available lairs that a restriction be placed on pre-sale of lairs in cemeteries based on the annual current sale rate where there is less than 10 years of available land remaining.
- 3.4 Annual monitoring of available lair numbers will be carried out with updates being provided to Members, detailing numbers of lairs and cemetery capacity, as noted at the Environment, Development and Infrastructure Committee in March 2023.

4.0 CONCLUSION

4.1 This report provides the Mid Argyll, Kintyre and Islands Area Committee with an update on cemetery provision.
