Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund 2023-24

The TSI has been reviewing applications for year three of the Scottish Government's Communities Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund (CMHWB Fund).

In Argyll and Bute, funds to be disbursed total £282k - but requests for support amounted to double this and came from over 70 organisations.

Applications were particularly strong this year and indicate the level of need in Argyll and Bute.

42 groups have been supported and grant letters are being sent out.

Groups that have been unsuccessful will be offered support from their TSSA and signposted to other available funds.

Community Wealth Building strategy report

The TSI has been leading on the commissioning of a Community Wealth Building (CWB) strategy and action plan for Argyll and Bute's Community Planning Partnership (CPP).

The January 2024 meeting approved the 20 high level recommendations, and the April 2024 CPP meeting will approve the final report.

All recommendations are centred around 5 pillars:-

- Plural ownership of the economy.
- Making financial power work for local places.
- Fair employment and just labour markets.
- Progressive procurement of goods and services.
- Socially productive use of land and property.

Watch this space for further work to implement the recommendations as well as the forthcoming Scottish Government legislation on CWB.

Argyll and Bute Climate Action Network (ABCAN)

With funding from the Scottish Government, Argyll and the Isles Coast and Countryside Trust (ACT) is leading on the establishment of the Argyll and Bute Climate Action Network, supported by Time for Change and the TSI.

The goal of the network is to provide grassroots community level support to promote climate knowledge, mitigation and action. There are four local engagement leads mirroring the administrative areas of Argyll and Bute and to March 2024 there is £40,000 in seed capital funding available for micro and small climate action projects.
