1.	WELCOME Raymond Park welcomed everyone to the meeting and noted apologies. He thanked Oban Fire Station for the use of their facilities.	
2.	MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 21 JANUARY 2009. Minutes of previous meeting dated 21 January 2009 were agreed.

	<p>Carron Tobin (National Park) informed the committee that the 3 SOAs that the National Park is involved in are all very different. Other partners involved in more than one SOA also confirmed that there are different approaches (e.g. SPT, Police, HITRANS etc). Each of those partners will sign off the different SOAs at board meetings – the precise process will be slightly different in each partner organisation.</p> <p>When the question of whether all partners had to physically sign the SOA was raised it was agreed that there was no need for all partners to sign it off and Dick Walsh, as Chair of the CPP would sign on behalf of the Partnership.</p>	
5.	<p>CPP CONSTITUTION/PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT</p> <p>The gaps in the document - 3.2 Thematic Groups/Local Area Planning Group and Appendix 1 – 4.1/4.2 Thematic Groups/Local Area Planning Group will be addressed over the next few weeks as discussions take place with key Council Officers and SOA strategic leads.</p> <p>Whether the document constituted a legal commitment was discussed and it was agreed that a paragraph would be added to the CPP Constitution/Partnership Agreement explaining that the document did not constitute a legal contract but was an agreement to commit to a common agenda</p> <p><u>Action Point</u> Eileen Wilson to liaise with Nigel Stewart with regards to the wording.</p>	Eileen Wilson/ Nigel Stewart
6	<p>COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW GROUP/ACTION PLAN/THEMATIC AND LOCAL AREA PLANNING GROUP DEVELOPMENT</p> <p>As Items 6, 7 and 8a were all connected it was agreed to cover in one item.</p> <p>Nigel Stewart updated the partnership on the council's commitment to reviewing their political management arrangements and advised that there is a bit of work to be done to ensure that linkages are made to the CPP.</p> <p>This work involves a number of people – Shirley McLeod (Corporate Services Manager, Bute and Cowal) will be taking the lead in the development of the Local Area Planning Groups and Lynn Smillie (Corporate Services Manager, Helensburgh and Lomond) will be leading on the Thematic Group developments. .</p> <p>It was suggested that a Time Limited Group be set up to ensure that CPP partners are involved in these structural developments. 3 people have been identified as key to this process as they are strategic leads in</p>	

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	<p>the SOA and will be the leads in the new theme groups formed to create content for the new community plan.</p> <p>Douglas Hendry, Argyll and Bute Council – Social Affairs Andrew Campbell, Scottish Natural Heritage - Environmental Douglas Cowan, Highlands and Island Enterprise – Economic</p> <p>It was agreed that Raymond Park and Derek Leslie, as Chair and Vice Chair of the Management Committee, be involved in the above Time Limited Group. This group will be known as the Community Plan Review Group</p> <p>Sally Reid advised that at the November Seminar there was general agreement that the role of the Thematic groups would be :-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To review the Community Plan - To set up Performance Management arrangements - To identify appropriate Strategic Partnerships <p>Sally Reid advised that although the timescales were challenging they were achievable.</p> <p>Brian Barker and Eileen Wilson will be meeting with Area Corporate Services Managers on the 19th of March to discuss further how this process should be taken forward.</p> <p>It is essential the 3rd Sector are kept informed of developments and are able to participate in ongoing discussions. The Community Plan Review Group and the groups developing the community plan content will consider how best to ensure all partners are able to contribute.</p> <p>The Action Plan was discussed with content and timescales agreed</p>	
8b)	<p>COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY</p> <p>b) Better Community Engagement</p> <p>It was agreed that the CPP would return an expression of interest to be considered for involvement in the Scottish Government's Better Community Engagement pilot project. 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10	<p>BUSINESS GATEWAY AND CPP EUROPEAN FUNDING UPDATE</p> <p>Business Gateway</p> <p>The Council will take over responsibility for Business Gateway from 1st April 2009. This is a new service in the Highlands and Islands area , but currently operates in the Helensburgh and Lomond area. The service development process has been subject to detailed negotiations between Highlands and islands Enterprise, Scottish Government, Councils and Scottish Enterprise. In Argyll and Bute the Council and HIE are working very closely together, with the main objective being no detriment in service to our customers. There will be a phased transition in Argyll and Bute, with a 'soft launch' in April. The recruitment process is currently underway for Council Business Gateway staff. All enquiries for business support should go to 0845 609 6611 or www.bgateway.com and links will be available on the Council and HIE websites. Development of the service will be ongoing with partner involvement a key part of that process.</p> <p>Sue Gledhill advised that Business Starter initiative ended and enquiries have tailed off and that the advice line for Business Gateway is about to be advertised. David Price pointed out that because of the downturn there's been an increase with PSYBT (Princes Scottish Youth Business Trust) Business start-ups.</p> <p>It was noted that Business Gateway staff will be located in the HIE Office in Lochgilphead.</p> <p>European Funding</p> <p>In response to an opportunity presented by the Highlands and islands European Regional Development Fund and European Social Fund Programmes to bid for ring fenced funding for Community Planning Partnerships, a sub group of CPP partners worked throughout 2008 to prepare a bid. This involved significant commitment by partners and the process of joint working was excellent in identifying joint and complementary priorities, particularly in relation to ESF. However, due to conflicting guidance, the bid could not be fully completed and has been withdrawn. The Management Committee agreed that the consideration and development of a Community Planning funding package be reconsidered by partners at the CPP Funding Hub and developed further if agreement could be reached.</p> <p>Raymond Park asked Andrew Campbell, as chair of the funding hub if we we're going down the right routes?
