

Tarbert to Cloanaig

from Tarbert Castle, up to the rocky hillside and high moors beyond. From here, you'll have panoramic views over Tarbert and across Loch Fyne to the Cowal peninsula

Steep sections with some steps. Narrow kissing gates. Varied surfaces, some narrow, rough and rocky but usually dry.

Section 1: Tarbert to Claonaig

— Kintyre Way



Starting from Tarbert's bustling harbor and yacht haven, the Kintyre Way begins its journey down the East coast of Kintyre. From Tarbert Castle the path winds up through the forest, climbing high above the coastline you will be rewarded with panoramic views over to the island of Arran across the Kilbrannan Sound. Cross open moorland, then descend through forestry to the small village of Skipness. If you have time walk to the imposing Skipness Castle or take lunch at the Seafood Cabin! From Skipness the route follows the quiet single track road along the coast to Claonaig where it is possible to take a ferry to the Isle of Arran. Please note there is limited accommodation in Claonaig and Skipness.
