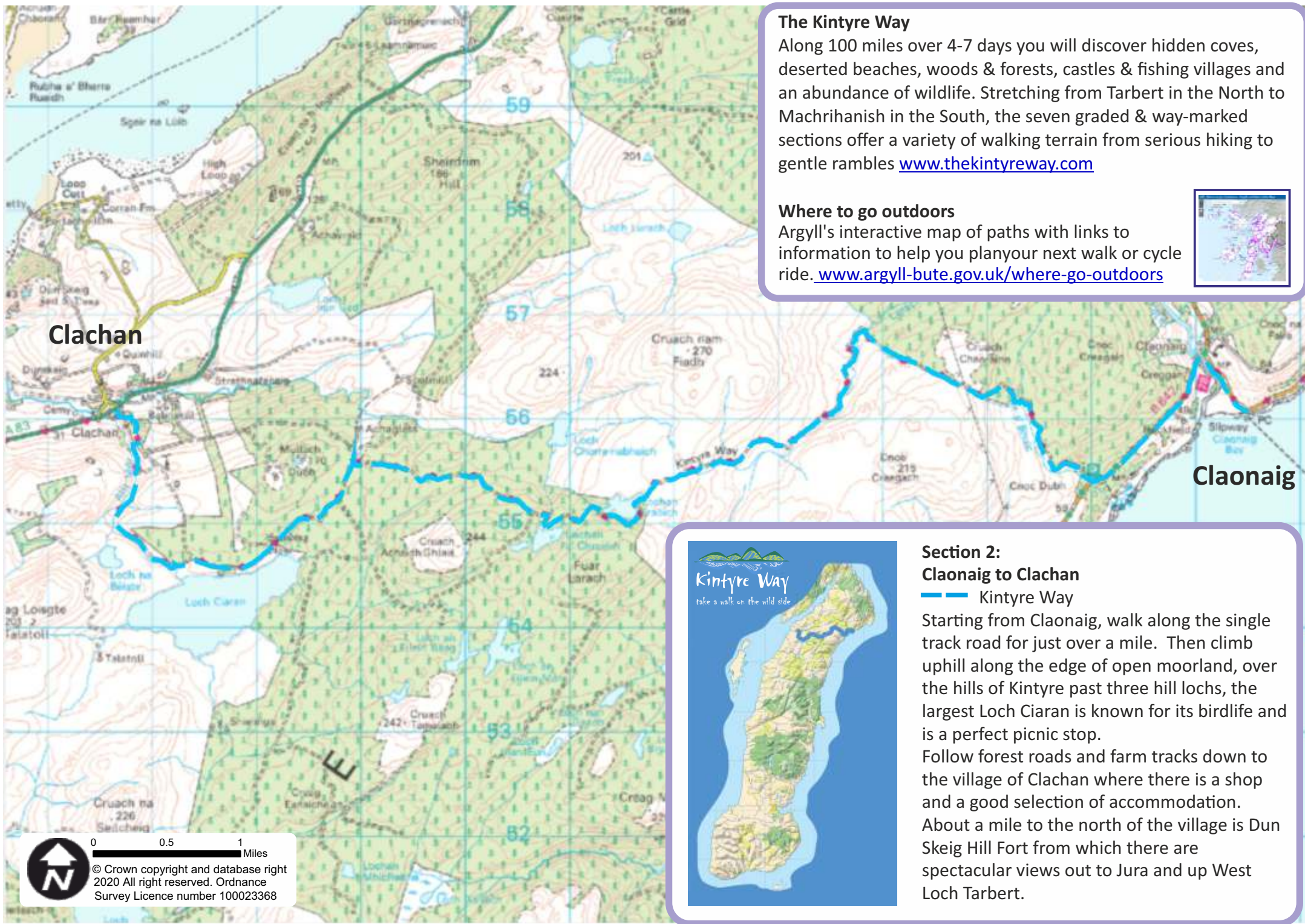

Section 2: Claonaig to Clachan

— Kintyre Way

Starting from Claonaig, walk along the single track road for just over a mile. Then climb uphill along the edge of open moorland, over the hills of Kintyre past three hill lochs, the largest Loch Ciaran is known for its birdlife and is a perfect picnic stop. Follow forest roads and farm tracks down to the village of Clachan where there is a shop and a good selection of accommodation. About a mile to the north of the village is Dun Skeig Hill Fort from which there are spectacular views out to Jura and up West Loch Tarbert.
