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### Background to LEIP

- Scottish Government (SG) flagship for education investment
- £2Billion of investment from Scottish Government & Council
- Running since 2019 ABC are in minority to not apply thus far (only 1 Island approved – Barra)
- SG pay 50% of build costs if certain criteria are met:-
  - Condition maintained at Grade A or B
  - Energy Efficient
  - Digitally enabled
  - Supports Economic Development
- Funding paid annually over 25 years
- No further rounds of LEIP in this Parliament (national capital review)


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## Argyll & Bute – Our Learning Estate

- Argyll and Bute consists of: 5621 Primary Pupils, 4597 Secondary
  - ▶ 65 primary schools 49 with ELC
  - 3 stand alone nurseries (1 outdoors)
  - 23 ELC Partner Providers
  - ▶ 5 secondary schools 2-18 schools (CAMPUS) 2 inc Gaelic
  - 1 special school
- Future visions set out in our Learning Estate Strategy
- Mainland schools £180m investment
- Island Equity Mull & Islay highest priority
  - Of these Mull is considered to be top priority based on suitability of existing estate
- Educational experience, attainment & digital learning + Educational Benefit

#### Process & Timescales



- July 2022 LEIP Board issued invitations to Council to make a bid
- August 2022 Pre Engagement with Community + stakeholders
- September Full Council Meeting to consider submission of bid
- October 2022 Submission of LEIP Bid to Scottish Government
- December 2022 LEIP Board announcement of successful bids
- February 2023 (for 6 months) Statutory Community Engagement
- February 2023 to 2025 Project Development
- December 2027 New facilities to be opened

Expectation is that more bids than in previous phases + geographic spread. This is a nationally competitive process & no guarantee that a bid will be successful.

Council to fund all up front & wholly meet any non-eligible costs.

- Need your input & support. Team approach on a national level to give best chance of success.








#### **Educational Benefits**

## The Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010 ('the 2010 Act')


- This act sets out the consultation process that local authorities must follow when proposing a permanent change to any of their schools.
- You play a vital role in your child's education and your opinions are crucial when a change to their school is being proposed.
- When proposing a major change to a school(s) the local authority must:
  - Publish a proposal paper, including a statement of the educational benefits of what's proposed
  - Set a consultation period of at least 6 weeks of term time
  - Let parents and the Parent Council know about the consultation and invite responses
  - Hold a public meeting Invite Education Scotland to prepare a report on the educational aspects of the proposal
  - Publish a consultation report which responds to issues raised through the consultation period
