

How good is your place? Area wide engagement results using the Place Standard Tool

Between May and October 2019, the Community Planning Partnership (CPP) used <u>the Place</u>

<u>Standard tool</u> to engage residents in Argyll and Bute on how they feel about the place(s) that they live and work in Argyll and Bute.

We are very grateful to all the responses that we received. We hope you find the information easy to understand and of interest to you and your community.

We are pleased to see that the thematic areas of Natural Space, Feeling Safe, Identity and Sense of Belonging and Social Contact came out with the highest scores, needing the least improvement, when considering Argyll and Bute as a whole.

The engagement has been undertaken at a place-based level and respondents provided their postcode, groupings of postcodes have created the settlement/community level detail.

The results are available for community groups and partner agencies to use, for example, to assist with service planning or for community-led action plans.

Please note: The information is the views of individuals who responded to the engagement. We trust that the information provided will be viewed within the context of which it is provided. We are grateful to all those who have taken part in the consultation and believe in sharing information for openness and transparency.

We appreciate that the documents can be lengthy due to the amount of information and we hope that the format is user-friendly.

Next steps



There is just one dial-a-bus on the island and so it can be difficult to get from a to b if the bus is already booked up. Other than that there is no other public transport.

There is no normal public transport on Tiree. We have a ring and ride service which is very helpful of course.

There is only a ring and ride bus which can be unreliable.

Affordable housing for young folk Job opportunities Cycle paths

An indoor activity facility with soft play and pool. More decent paying jobs and better/quicker access to the mainland.

House prices and affordable housing. Capping the holiday housing on the island to provide opportunity for long term stays for families. And a safe indoor play/activity space for toddler children and teenagers.

Lack of supported/sheltered housing

On the Island I think the priority areas should be: Employment Opportunities, Sustainability of lie line ferry service, Affordable housing, Improve Education

Perhaps a bit more for adults to do.

Sustainable tourism Jobs for young House prices out of local people's reach

Too many fences being put up on common grazing land stopping access to beaches.

Transport (ferry and air) are key infrastructure requirements Argyll and Bute Council is underfunded and demoralised and responds to requests poorly The public toilets are not cleaned to the necessary standards

What actions could be taken to deal with these?

A space being made for the youth and young. And sorting the housing in whatever way can be possible. Lowering rentals and offering first time buyers or buyers to the island a helping hand in some way. Make the island more appealing for young families to help stop the de line kids and young families.

Allow tourism infrastructure Ban sales of empty property as holiday lets

Council to provide more flexible working opportunities on the Island. Government to provide Cal Mac with improved boats. Build affordable housing that local folk can buy. Attract higher quality teachers and provide housing for them.

Getting a football league up and running again would help

Make them remove them.

Put money into infrastructure on the island.
