Royal Countryside Fund – Supporting Rural Communities

The UK-wide Supporting Rural Communities grant programme is launching on **Friday 10th January 2025**.

This new differentiated funding will support transformative, community-led initiatives across the UK, unlocking the huge potential for positive change in rural communities. The aim is to support innovative solutions that will “power up, not prop up” communities, inspiring change and encouraging economic vibrancy.

Organisations can apply for grants of up to £25,000 over a period of 24 months to deliver activities along the themes of:

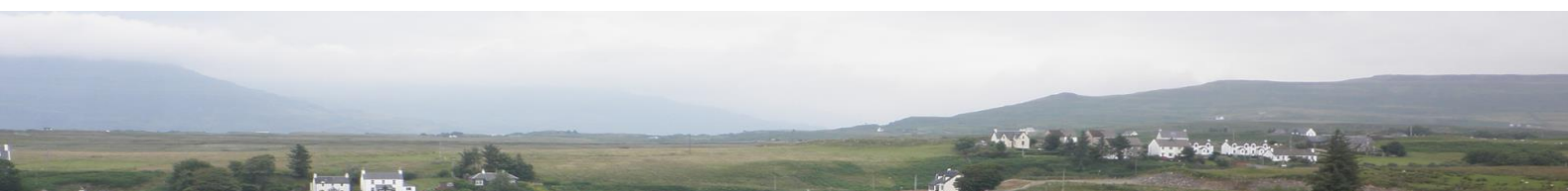
- **Keeping young people in the countryside**
- **Powering up rural communities**
- **Increasing environmental sustainability**
- **Building emergency resilience in rural areas.**

Support will be focused on isolated rural areas where the activity is required due to a lack of alternative services. Projects must be community led and show that they actively listen to, understand and respond to the needs of their local community. The fund is also looking for community organisations that demonstrate one or more of the following characteristics:

- **Working towards a long-term vision**
- **Facilitating collaboration/connectedness**
- **Demonstrating innovation.**

ARTS AND CULTURE

1. Universal Music UK Sound Foundation School Fund

Funds of £1,000 are available. The scheme aims to support the access to music for schools, students and teachers by supporting the purchase of musical instruments and equipment.

2. Golsoncott Foundation

Funds of up to £3,000 are available from the Foundation whose declared objective is to promote, maintain, improve and advance the education of the public in the arts generally and, in particular, the fine arts and music.

3. Idlewild Trust

The Trust offers grants to registered charities working in the following two areas:

- Arts Grants: Nurturing Early Stage Professionals - grants support training opportunities for emerging professionals, working creatively and backstage, within the performing and visual arts, post-training, and at an early stage in their career.
- Conservation Grants: Objects and Works of Art - grants support the conservation of cultural heritage of recognised national and international importance in museums, libraries, galleries, historic buildings, or landscapes accessible to the public.

The maximum grant available is £7,000.

4. Creative Scotland - Youth Music Initiative CPD and Training Fund

Funding is available for individuals and organisations who work with children and young people on out-of-school music projects in Scotland to undertake training and professional development opportunities. The funding is intended to support individuals, organisations and networks to undertake training and continuing professional development that will strengthen youth music in Scotland for the benefit of young people. Training and CPD should deliver the following outcomes:

- People delivering youth music develop their skills and confidence.
- The development, strengthening and increased sustainability of the youth music sector.
- The provision of increasingly high quality, efficient, innovative youth music services.

Awards to individuals will typically range from £100 to £1,000, while awards for organisations will generally range from £500 to £5,000.

5. Awards for Young Musicians

Grants of £100 to £2,000 are available for the UK's most talented young instrumentalists in any genre, aged five to 17 years of age who, because of financial need, may be prevented from fulfilling their creative potential.

6. BFI National Lottery Audience Projects Fund

Grants of between £20,000 and £200,000 are available to support various audience related activities in the UK, including film festivals, distribution releases, multiplatform distribution proposals, touring film programmes, large scale and ambitious film programmes. Applications are accepted all year round but must be submitted 16 weeks before the start of any funded activity.

The fund is open all year round

BUSINESS AND ENTERPRISE

9. Highlands and Islands Enterprise - Green Grant Fund

The funding is intended to help businesses or social enterprises with projects to reduce or green their energy usage and make progress towards achieving net zero carbon emissions, for example energy efficiency measures, renewables, active non-commuting business travel and waste management. Grants of between £20,000 and £250,000 are available (covering between 10% and 40% of the total cost of a project).

10. Oban Business Improvement District Frontage Grant Scheme

The Oban Business Improvement District Frontage Grant Scheme offers grant funding to any existing commercial business operating in the town that wishes to improve the appearance of its business frontage, signage or environment. The maximum grant will be £1,200 per business or 75% of the costs. There is an expectation that businesses will use local contractors wherever possible.

11. Access to Work

Financial assistance is available to help organisations in Great Britain with any extra employment costs that result from employing a person with a disability.

Access to Work provides grants to employers towards extra employment costs which result from an employee having a disability. The programme aims to provide practical advice and support to disabled people and their employers, in order to overcome work related obstacles which result from disability.

LaunchMe is an accelerator programme for ambitious, social enterprise start-ups in Scotland. LaunchMe is looking to support eight social enterprises with the commitment and ambition to grow and achieve greater social impact.

19. Challenger Children's Fund

Small grants are available to help meet the needs of physically disabled children (under the age of 18) in Scotland. Grants of up to £750 may be considered. More may be granted in exceptional circumstances.

Grants are available for registered charities and other not-for-profit organisations to deliver projects and activities that support children with additional needs across Scotland. Trefoil is a large grant-making charity registered in Scotland. It is dedicated to supporting the development of children and young people with additional needs in Scotland to enable them to maximise their capabilities and achieve as much independence as possible.

21. Kelly Family Charitable Trust

22. Family Fund Trust

The Trust, therefore, encourages families to demonstrate the kind of support that would best meet their needs in easing the stress of caring for severely disabled children.

Grants of up to £500 are available.

34. Money Saving Expert (MSE) Charity

A limited number of grants are available to small to medium-sized UK not-for-profit organisations that deliver activities which make a lasting impact on how people think, behave and manage their money. The maximum grant is £10,000. The MSE Charity will consider full project cost recovery, but costs must only relate to the project itself and not the organisation's core funding.

35. Carraig Gheal Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund

The next round of funding for the main grants for the Carraig Gheal Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund opens again on 1st November. 36. Bank of Scotland Foundation - Empower Programme

Unrestricted grants are available to registered charities in Scotland that support vulnerable groups. Maximum value £150,000. The funding can be used for core costs, delivery costs, project costs and/or general running costs.

Organisations should demonstrate:

- The vulnerabilities of the people they support.
- How their work makes or will make a difference to the lives of vulnerable people.
- The necessity for the funding and what unrestricted funding would allow the organisation to do.

Examples of vulnerable groups include people:

- With limited English language skills.
- With poor mental health.
- Experiencing homelessness.
- Experiencing poverty.
- Experiencing unemployment.
