(B875 GREENWOOD JUNCTION-DRUMACHLOY BRIDGE ROAD, ISLE OF BUTE) (BUTEFEST EVENT)

(TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 2025

On Thursday the 3rd July 2025, Argyll and Bute Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 62 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, made the above named Order.

The restrictions, which are desirable because of considerations of public safety and convenience whilst the Butefest Music Festival is taking place, will be in operation when indicated by signs between 0900 hours on Friday the 25th of July and 1700 hours on Monday the 28th of July 2025.

- No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on both sides of that section which extends from its junction with the Glenmore Road (UC006) in a south westerly direction to the Drumachloy Bridge, a distance of 770 metres or thereby.
- No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on that section from its junction with A844 in a south westerly direction to its junction with Glenmore Road (UC006) a distance of 2 Kilometres or thereby.
- No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on that section which extends from its junction with the Glenmore Road (UC006) in a south westerly direction for a distance of 1 Kilometres or thereby.

Nothing in this Order shall apply to any vehicle that is:

- a) being driven upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform;
- b) being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.
