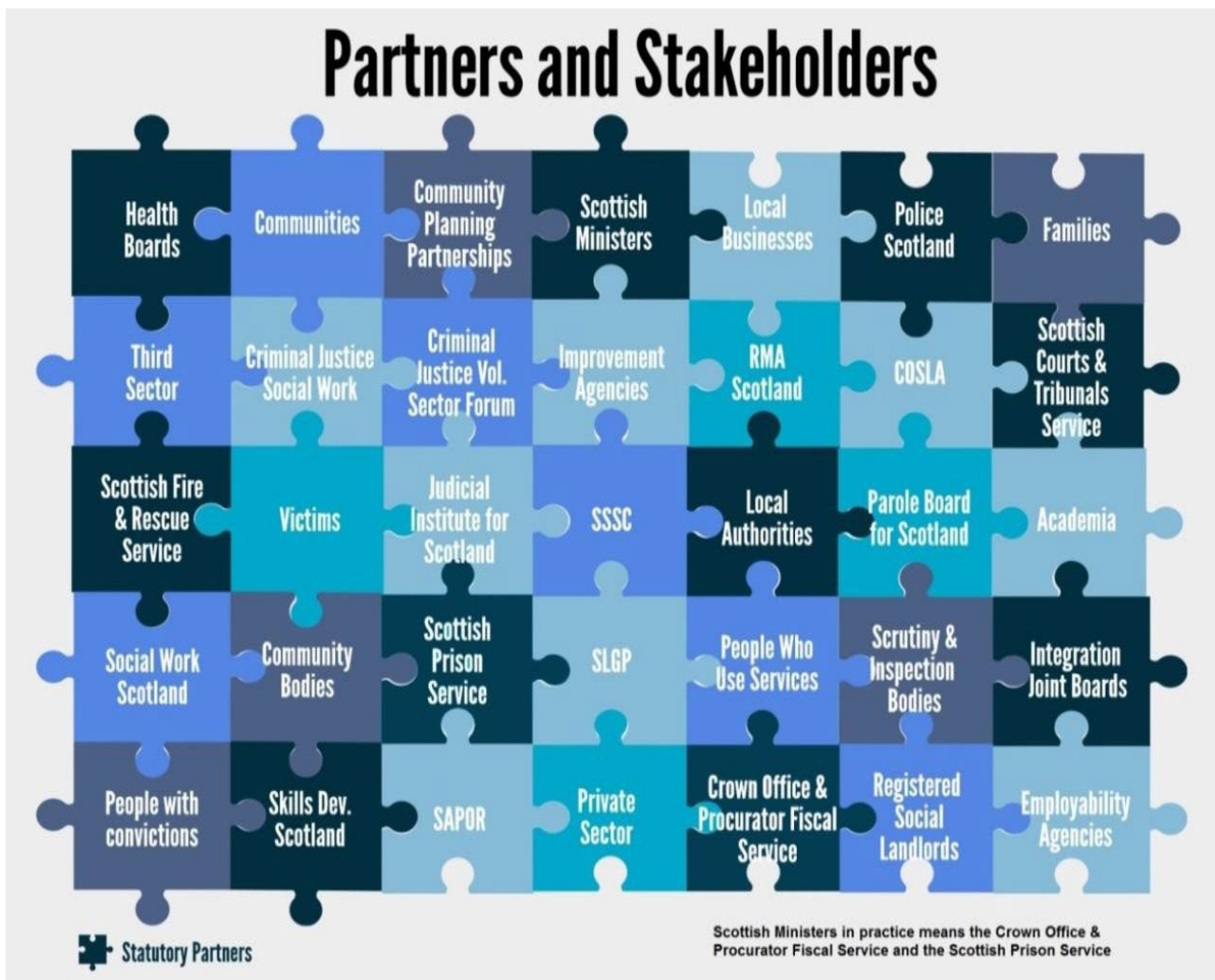

- Strategic connections with the Alcohol and Drugs Partnership for aligned priorities is underway to support diversionary activities
