Toy Trust

Grants of up to £5,000 are available for registered charities undertaking projects to support disadvantaged and disabled children who are under 13 years of age within the UK and abroad. Funding is available to help disadvantaged children aged below 13 years and their families to:

Alleviate suffering.

Support children through awful experiences.

Encourage achievement through adversity.

Purchase vital equipment.

Provide care.

Bolster existing initiatives.

Initiate brand new projects.

Satisfy basic needs.

Projects should:

Show real benefit for relieving hardship and suffering to beneficiaries.

Run for a minimum of one full year.

Be in support of children and projects regardless of faith, sex or disability.

Aberlour Urgent Assistance Fund

The Urgent Assistance Fund remains committed to providing emergency cash grants to help families who are struggling to provide essentials such as food, heating, beds and clothing for their children. Applications must be submitted via a sponsor. Sponsors can be frontline professionals working for a registered charity, housing association or public sector organisation who:

- are working directly with the children/young person
- have made a full assessment of the child's or young person's needs

Children and young people must meet the following criteria:

- Aged under 21 OR aged 25 and under if the young person is care experienced.
- Living on a low income and experiencing financial hardship.
- Have experienced a crisis that has recently had a significant and enduring impact on:
 - their wellbeing
 - their development and education
 - The family or young person has recently taken action to improve their situation, are actively engaging with support and are moving on from the crisis.

Mother and Baby Unit Family Fund

A Mother and Baby Unit (MBU) is a specialist inpatient unit for people who:

- develop severe mental health problems in the later stages of pregnancy
- develop severe mental health problems during the year after their baby is born

You can claim towards the cost of travel, food and accommodation when you're visiting someone in an MBU, if you are the:

- partner of the person who gave birth
- baby's other parent
- main carer of the person who gave birth

If you have children who are 16 and under, you can claim towards the costs travel, food and accommodation during their visits to the MBU too.

Connected for Good Fund

Argyll and Bute Connected For Good fund offers financial support and wider confidential professional help to anyone suffering hardship.

Working in partnership with the Argyll, Lomond & the Islands Energy Agency (ALlenergy), Argyll and Bute Citizen Advice Bureau, Bute Advice Centre and the Community Food households with low incomes and no access to cash savings can apply for immediate financial support. The Fund will help support daily living expenses. If successful an award of £100 will be made to the claimant.

Foundation Scotland - Volant Charitable Trust Small Grants Programme

Grants of up to £5,000 are available for organisations to support projects to address poverty and social deprivation during the current cost of living crisis, with emphasis on children, young people and women. **Will re-open early September.**

Aviva Foundation - Financial Futures Fund

The Aviva Foundation offers two distinct funding routes:

- The Financial Futures Fund, is for organisations delivering bold, long-term solutions to help people build financial resilience. Open to larger charities with an income of £1 million or more.
- The Communities Fund, supports projects and organisations that help people to take control of their financial wellbeing or protect the places they love in a changing climate. Open to small, local organisations with an annual income of up to £1 million.

NFU Mutual Charitable Trust

Grants up to £50,000 are available to large charitable groups and organisations in the UK for projects that further the objectives of the NFU Mutual Charitable Trust, particularly those that educate young people in rural areas and the relief of poverty in rural areas. The Trustees meet twice a year to consider applications received. These meetings are currently held in June and November. For the November meeting applications must be submitted by 4th October 2024. **The application window for the December 2026 meeting opens on 17th July.**

Scottish Hydro Electric Community Trust

Discretionary Grants are available to support charities and community projects with the cost of electricity supply connections - either to a new property or to upgrade an existing supply. For community projects a grant of routinely between 50% and 75% may be awarded and the benefit to the community will influence the grant. **Applications are also accepted from individuals most in need for domestic properties.**

Trefoil – Lillias Finlay Holiday Fund

Trefoil offers holiday grants to children and families who meet our development needs criteria.

Applicants for holiday grants should be under eighteen years old and living in Scotland. Trefoil only funds holidays in the UK and does not support overseas trips. Applications for holiday grants are open and considered all year.

Please apply at least 12 weeks before your holiday. Your applications should be supported by two references.

National Lottery Community Fund - Fairer Life Chances (Scotland)

Grants are available to voluntary and community and public sector organisations in Scotland for projects that support children, young people and families, or help people to be healthier and have better access to support, with a focus on those experiencing poverty, discrimination and disadvantage. Grants of between £20,001 and £500,000 are available. However, it is expected that most grants will be for £250,000 or less.

Tesco Fruit and Veg Grants

The focus of the fund is getting schools who lack funds and resources to apply for extra financial help they might need to provide healthy food and activities that boost young people's mental and physical wellbeing.

Priority is given to projects working in schools and organisations nominated by Tesco staff.

Customers in Tesco stores throughout the UK vote on which of three local projects they wish to support.

The customer vote determines the amount of money a project receives:

Grants of up to £1,500 for the project with the most votes.
Grants of up to £1,000 for the second most votes.
Grants of up to £500 for the third most votes.
Projects will be shortlisted every four months.

Applications are open to all local good causes that support children and young people, with a particular focus on projects that incorporate provision of healthy food including fruit and veg, such as breakfast clubs, providing holiday club lunches or healthy snacks.

Examples include:

- Breakfast/after-school clubs that provide fruit and veg for pupils
- Sports clubs that provide healthy food as part of the project or at half time
- Growing initiatives to grow fruit and veg or cooking classes using the food to learn
- Holiday clubs that provide healthy meals and snacks
- Projects providing SEND provision with healthy snacks/meals
- Youth clubs that provide a healthy meal/snack
- Addressing holiday hunger amongst children outside of school time
- Healthy eating projects that support families to cook healthy meals on a budget
- Foodbanks to provide food support to families

BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme

Funding for the purchase of essential items to meet the most basic needs of children and young people in the UK who are facing exceptionally difficult circumstances. Where possible, items will be provided directly rather than awarding a cash grant.

British Gas Energy Trust

Grants are available to individuals and families across Great Britain to be used to help write off their energy debts. , regardless of energy provider.

The Trust offers two funds:

- Individuals and Families Fund - **Open to Credit and Pre-Payment Meter customers**
- British Gas Energy Support Fund – now closed

Both are intended to tackle fuel poverty by clearing the energy debts of struggling households and respond to the ongoing cost-of-living crisis. You do not need to be a British Gas customer to apply for this fund - you can be a British Gas Customer, or a customer from another supplier with arrears of up to £1,700.

Robertson Trust - Wee Grants

Grants of £300 to £2,000 are available for up to one year for small charities and community groups in Scotland carrying out charitable work in local communities to address poverty and trauma

COSARAF – Hardship Grants

Grants of up to £2,000 but only in exceptional circumstances will individuals receive a grant of more than £500 these are available for third party social organisations to support individuals and families across the UK who are in financial need and have exhausted all other sources of funding.

Faith in Community Scotland - Greener Spaces, Fairer Places

Grants of up to £500 are available to local faith groups and other related organisations for projects that address poverty and climate change in communities across Scotland.

Grants up to £300 are available to support families and individuals for essential personal and household needs to assist families and individuals with low incomes, particularly those living on benefits.

Cavell helps registered nurses, midwives, nursing associates and maternity support workers, both working and retired, when they're going through tough times. This is often due to illness, disability, older age, domestic abuse and the impact of the rise in living costs.

The Rozelle Trust

Financial assistance is available to smaller charities in Scotland that work to support the poor and disadvantaged in their local communities.

Trusthouse Charitable Foundation

Grants of £2,000 to £10,000 are available for small and medium sized local charities and not-for-profit organisations in the UK with a track record of success working to address local issues in communities of deprived rural areas.

Victim Support Scotland – Emergency Assistance Fund

Grants are available to support people affected by crime across Scotland and provide a wide range of goods and services to people who would typically lack access to financial help.

Pets Foundation - Preventing Pet Relinquishment Grants

Grants of up to £80,000 per year are available for projects which aim to keep pets with their owners and out of rescue, including projects providing emergency pet fostering for people facing crisis, subsidised veterinary care, neutering schemes and pet food banks.

Thomas Wall Trust - Grants for Individuals

The individual grants programme aims to support motivated adults living in the UK to undertake education and training that will increase their chances of employment.

Grants of up to £1,500 are available to undertake accredited vocational training up to level 3 ([Qualification levels explained](#)) and towards other costs associated with studying.

Veterans' Foundation

Grants are available for small and medium-sized charities and not-for-profit organisations that provide support to those in need among serving Armed Forces personnel, veterans, operationally qualified seafarers and their immediate families across the UK. Maximum value: £75,000.

Robertson Trust - Nurturing Relationships

Grants are available to registered charities working to support nurturing relationships within families and communities, to help break the cycle between persistent poverty and intergenerational trauma, and to support recovery.

Small Grants - £30,000 to £200,000.

Large Grants - £200,000 to £2 million.

Family Action - Welfare Grants Programme

The Welfare Grants Programme is aimed at people who already receive means-tested benefits but still need a little helping hand to afford basics or replace essentials like a broken washing machine. Together with emotional support this can help individuals and families avoid a bigger crisis and get back on track. The fund is open for applications for people over the age of 60 who live anywhere in the UK including Greater London. Applications can only be made by a suitable referring organisation such as a statutory agency or charity that provides health or social care, housing associations, probation services and GP's. Members of the public cannot apply themselves directly.

Grants are available for registered charities for projects in Scotland that address the charitable objectives of the Fund the advancement of education and eradication of poverty.

Heinz, Anna and Carol Kroch Foundation

Grants are available for charitable organisations in the UK working with individuals suffering severe poverty. The Foundation provides grants to assist individuals who are suffering from poverty and hardship and have an ongoing medical problem. Applications to support victims of domestic violence and the homeless are also considered. Applications can be submitted at any time and are considered by the trustees at bi-monthly meetings. Randal Charitable Foundation

Both small scale-grants (under £3,000) and larger-scale grants are available for UK based charities, voluntary groups, and other not-for-profit organisations to support projects and activities that directly assist people in the most desperate need, with a particular focus on directly saving lives and improving quality of life. The enquiry process will remain open until Trustees determine sufficient enquiries have been received. The enquiry window may be closed at any time and may be closed without further notice.

Inspiring Scotland - Bright Start Breakfasts Fund

Grants are available to primary schools, local authorities, third sector organisations and childcare providers in Scotland to expand and set up breakfast clubs for primary school children in Scotland. Grants are expected to be between £8,000 and £12,000, depending on the location and needs of the community and school. The Fund will run from August 2025 to June 2026.
