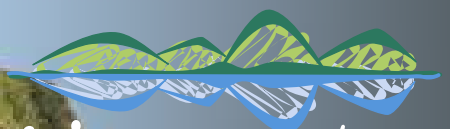

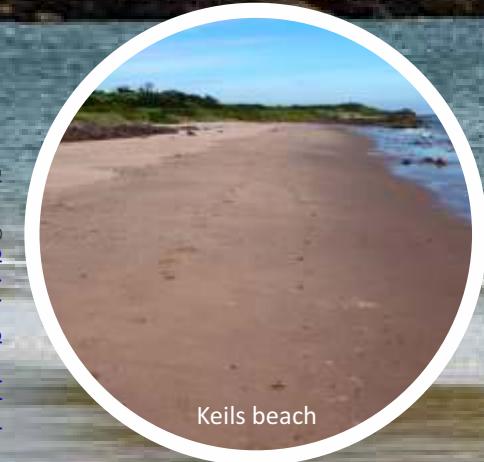

### Carradale to Campbeltown

The penultimate section follows the shores of Campbeltown Loch past Davaar Island. The single track road to Southend offers stunning seascapes. Head to the shore, follow a minor road to Mill Park joining the B842 on to Southend village

### Campbeltown to Southend

— Kintyre Way  
Follow the shore of Campbeltown Loch past Davaar Island, you can reach it at low tide along the Doirlinn, a natural causeway.

In 1887 Archibald MacKinnon painted the Crucifixion in a cave on the island which can still be seen. Continuing south, the quiet, single track road known locally as the Leerside, offers stunning views of Arran, the Ayrshire coast and Antrim Coast.

At Polliwilline Farm you turn off the road to walk along this beautiful coastline following farm tracks and beaches with views out to Sanda Island. At Kilmashenachan you join a single track road which you follow through Mill Park and on to Southend, a small village with a shop and café.
