If the Cultural Co-ordinator was not in post then someone would have to be identified to take over the application for the YMI Grant (191,000) and the resultant development work required by Creative Scotland alongside extensive modernisation work that is happening between YMI, the Instrumental Service and Creative Scotland. Also high risk to the Argyll Collection - the curation, restoration and management of a very valuable and nationally important art collection. This also proposes an indirect risk to the other art collections in Argyll.
