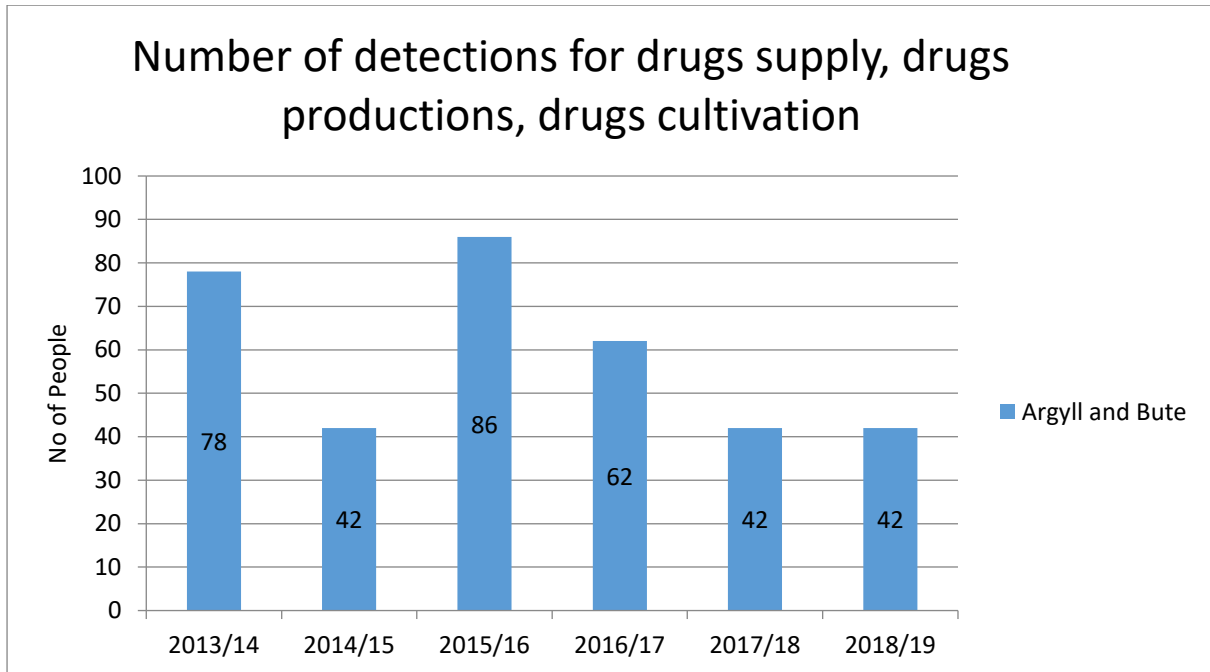

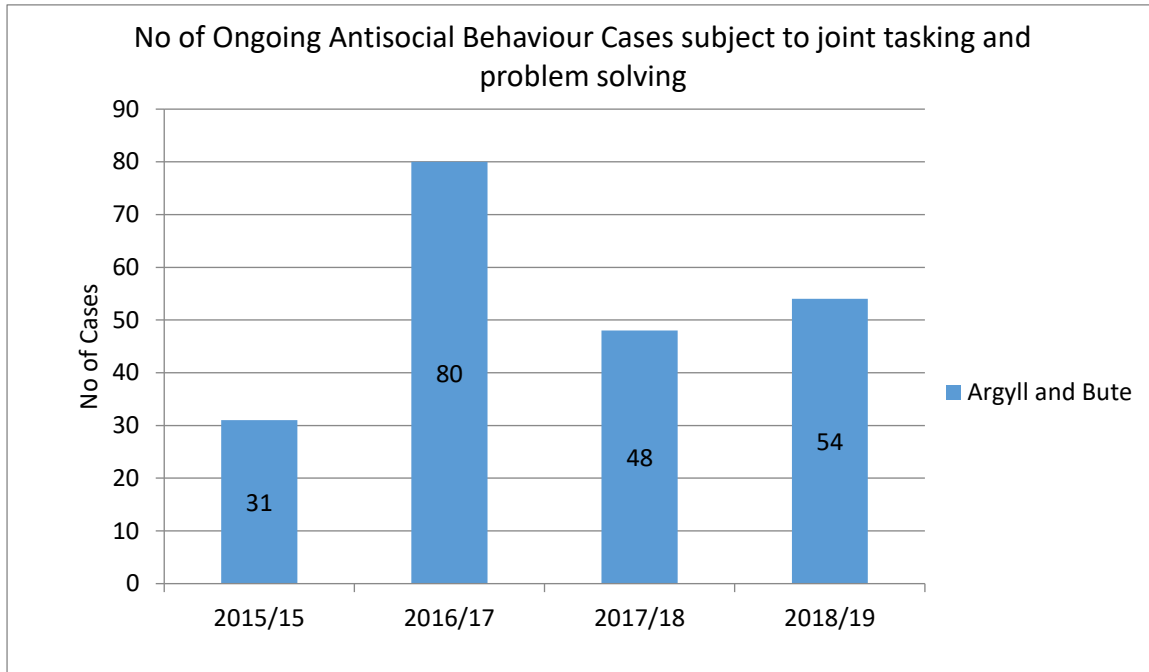

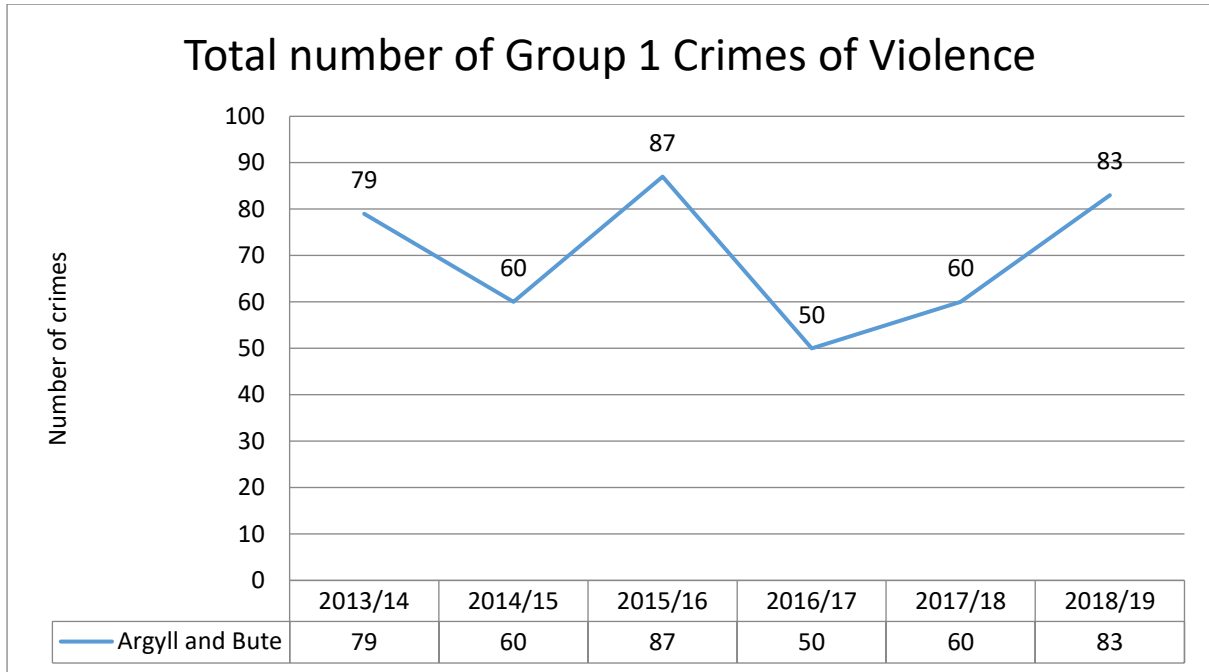

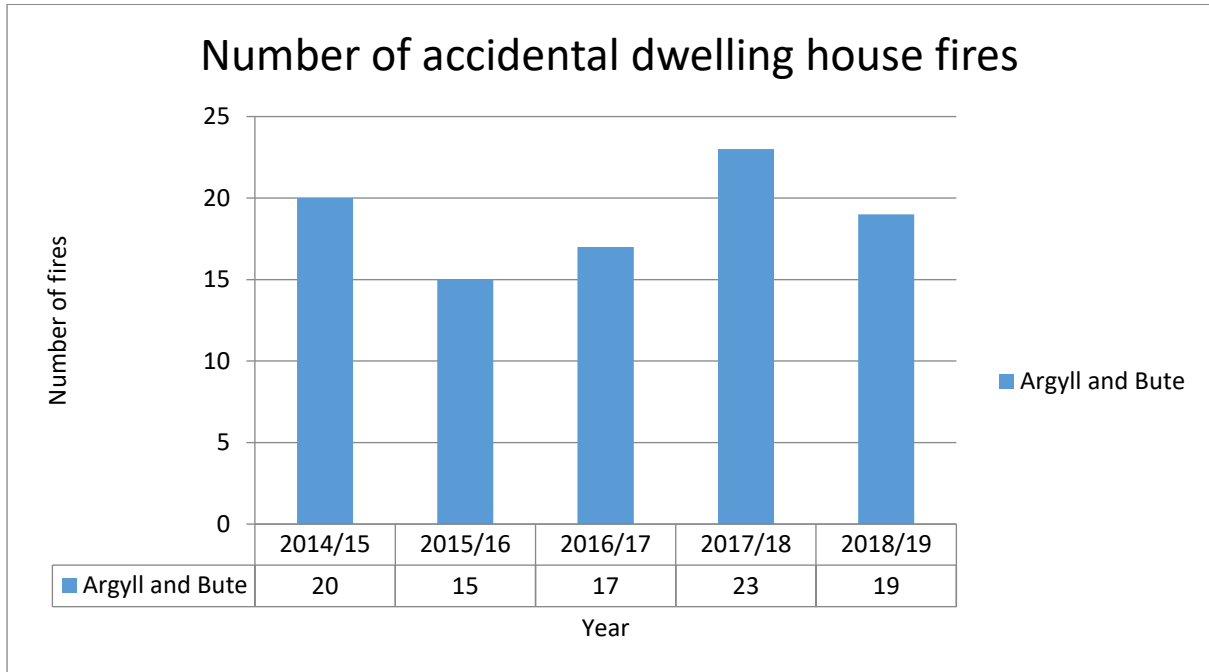

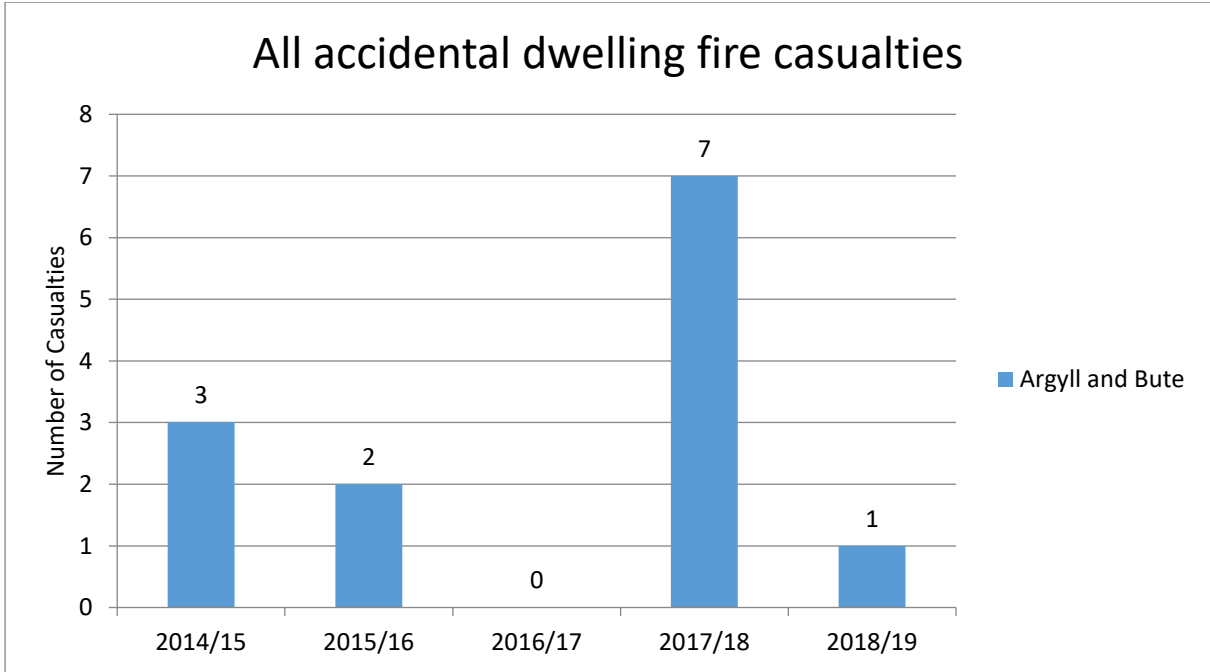


The number of accidental dwelling house fires in 2018/19 has decreased from the previous year.

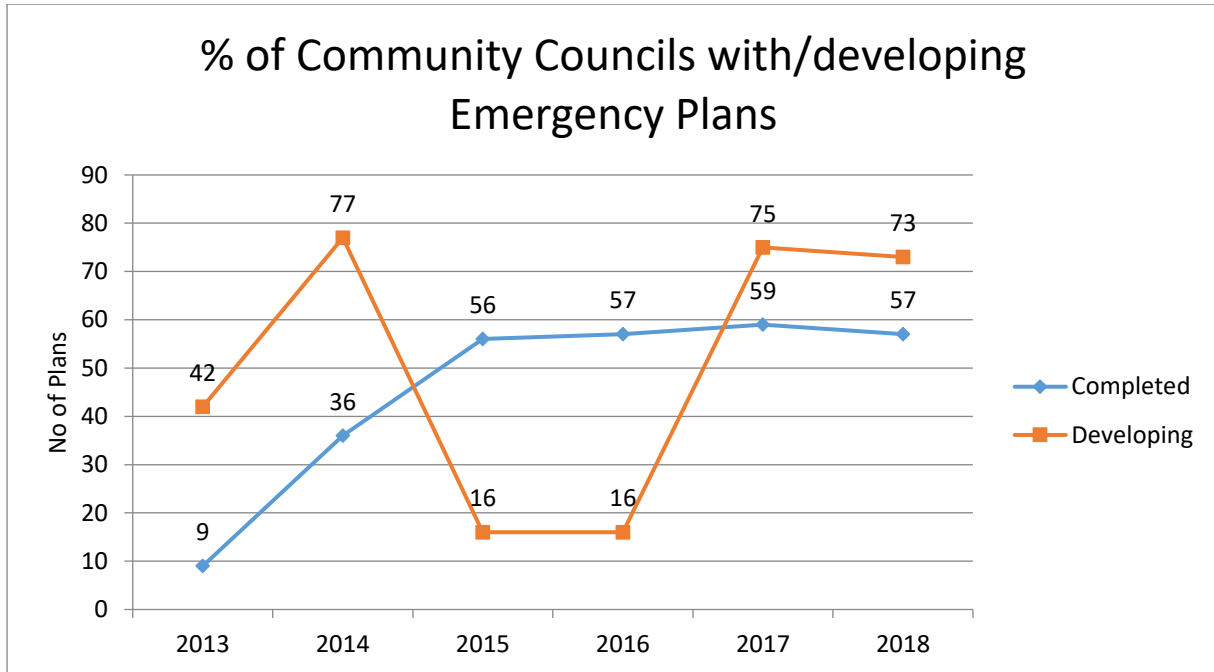


The number of accidental dwelling fire casualties has decreased in the past year.

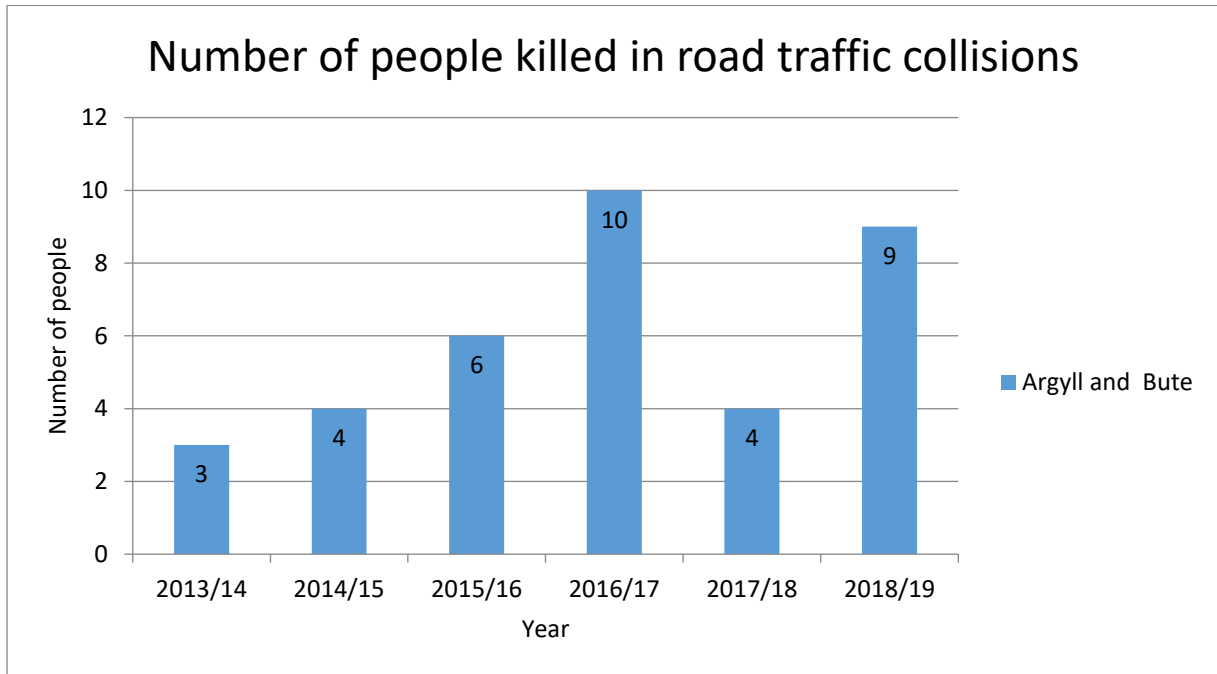


The percentage of community councils with a completed emergency plan has increased by 1% since 2015, resulting in 57% of the community councils within Argyll and Bute having a completed plan. The percentage of Community Councils that are developing plans has not changed since 2015 and remains at 16%.

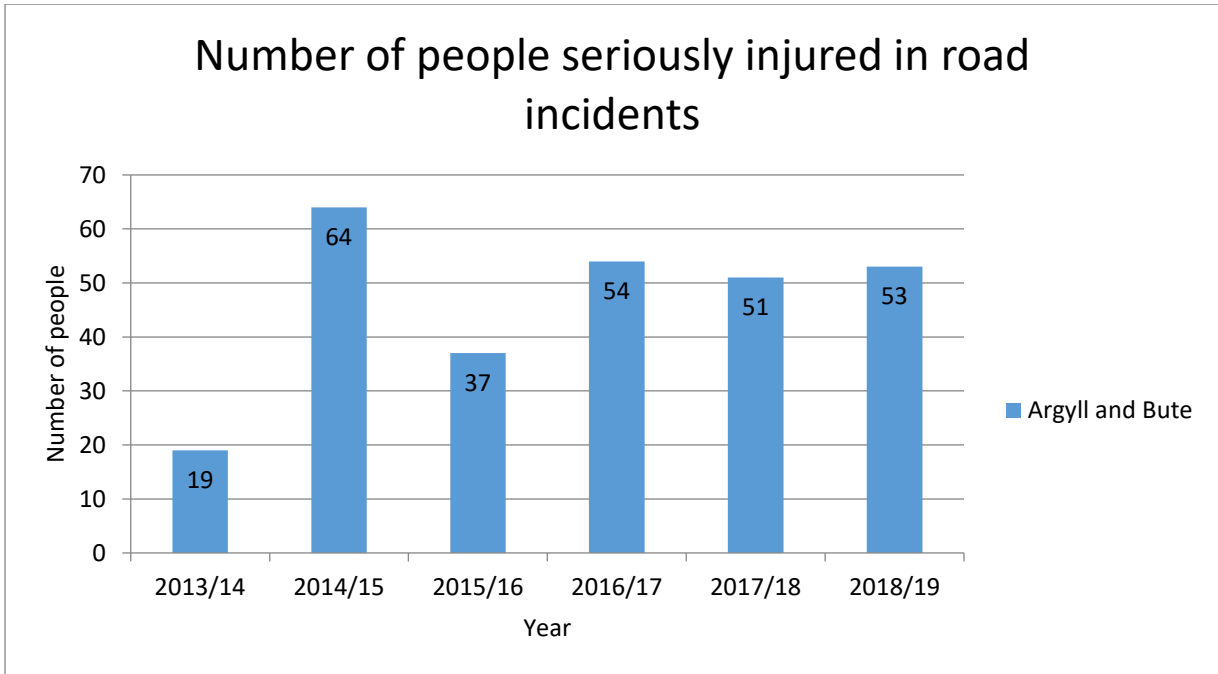


There has been an increase in the number of people killed in road traffic collisions in the 2018/19 financial year.

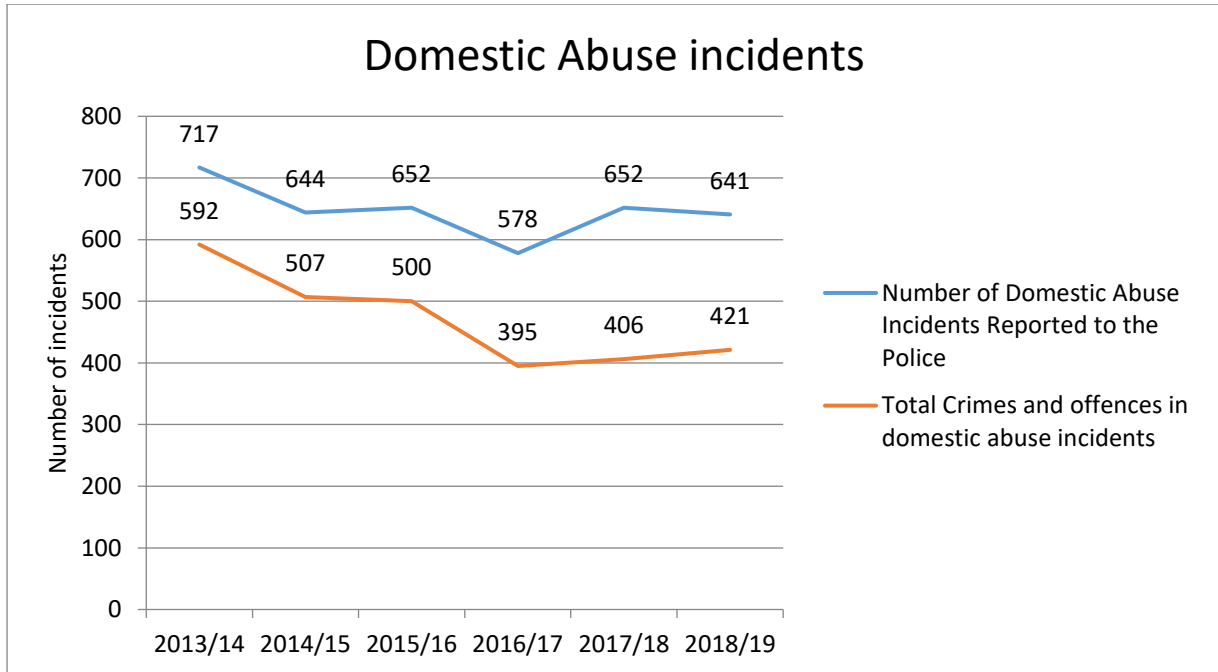


There has been a slight increase in the number of people seriously injured in road incidents from 51 to 53.

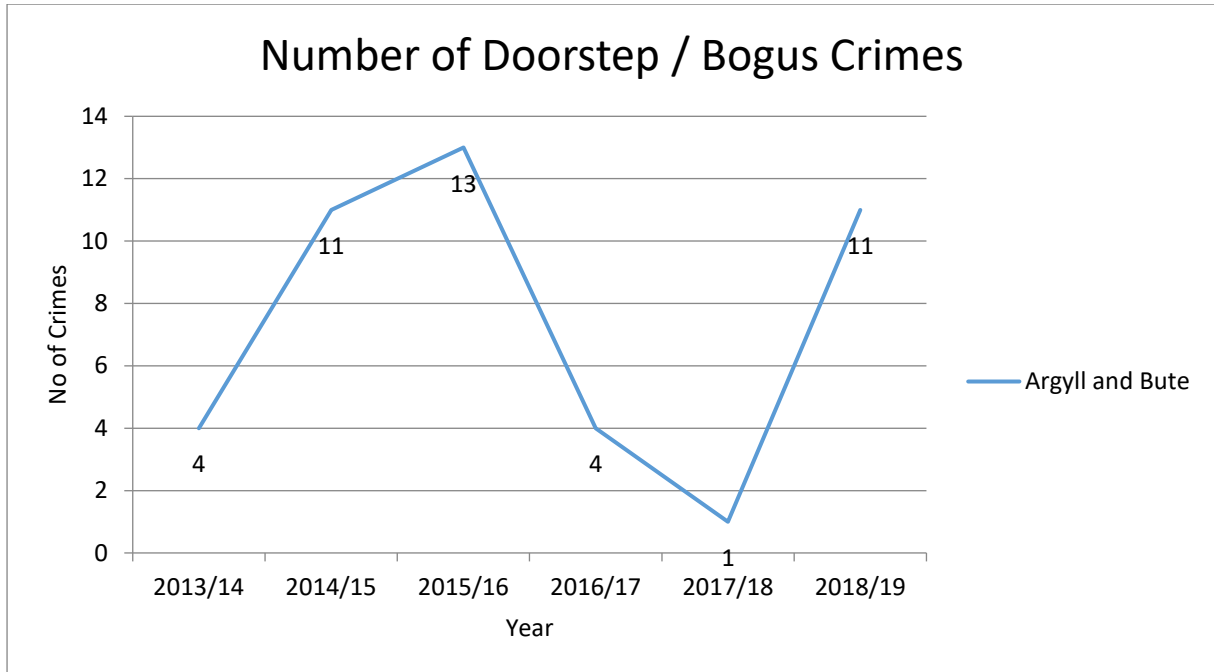


Compared to 2017/18 the total number of domestic abuse crimes and incidents recorded across Argyll and Bute remained fairly consistent. Domestic abuse incidents reduced by 1.7% from 652 to 641 and domestic abuse crimes increased by 3.7% from 406 to 421.

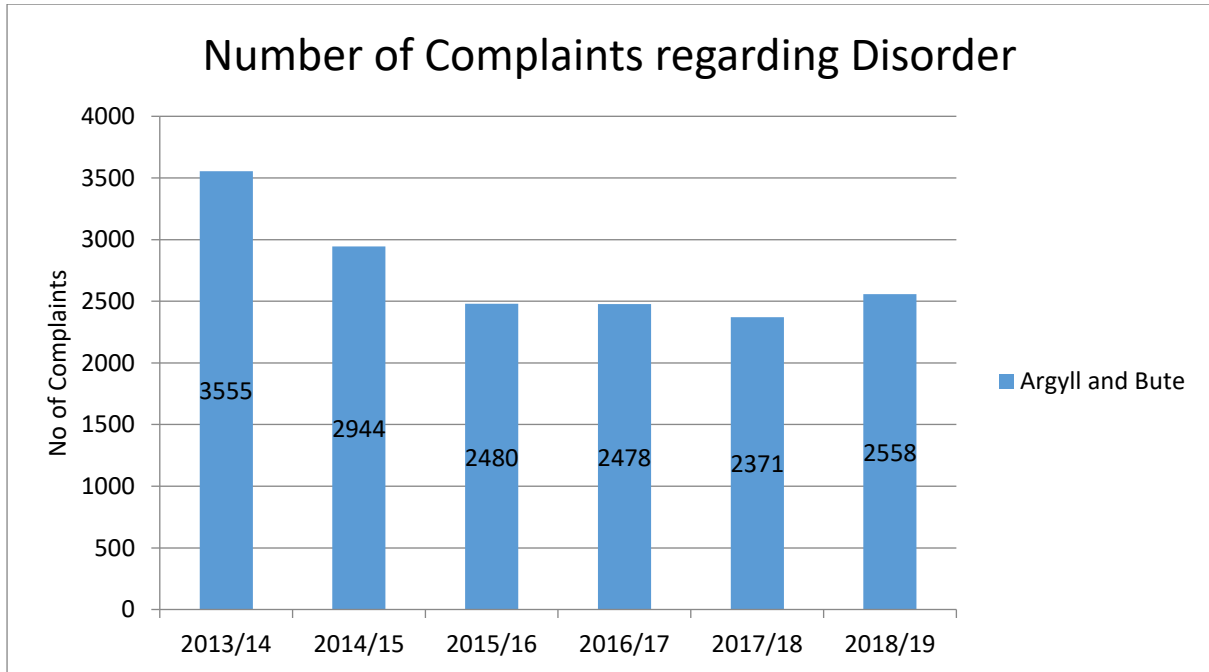


Bogus crimes have increased from 1 to 11 compared to the same period last year. Most crimes involve social engineering fraud.

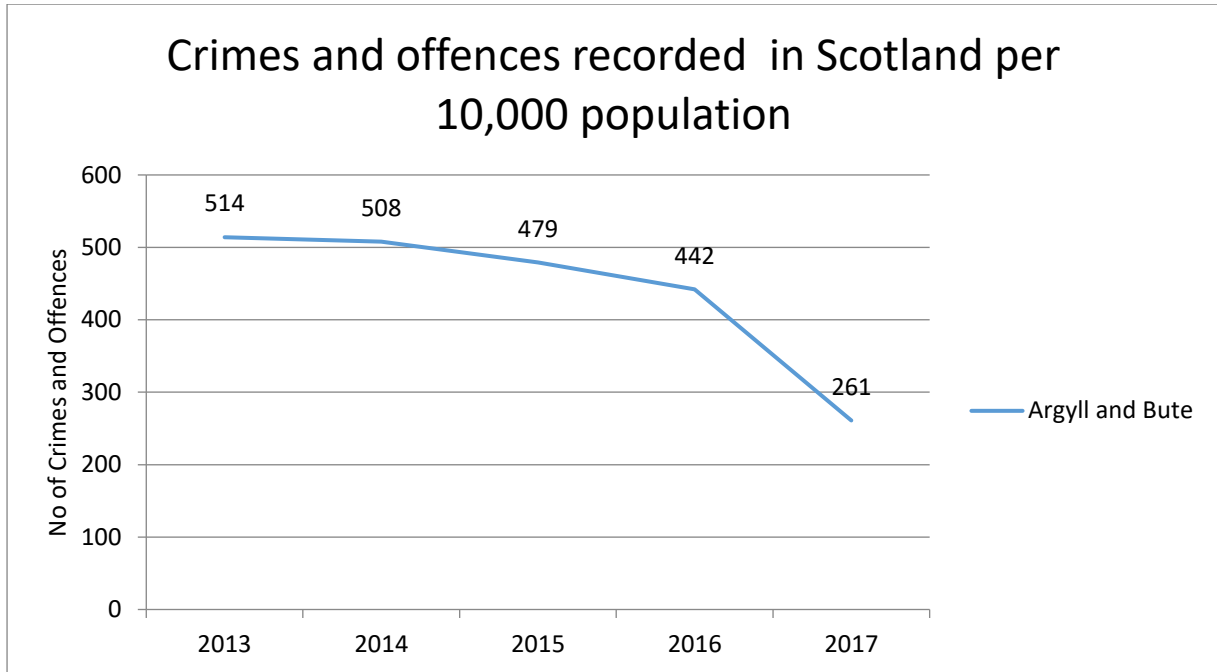


Complaints relating to disorder saw marginal change year on year (0.8%). Similarly, the total number of ASB related crimes including breach of the peace, CJS S.38 and drunk and disorderly conduct remain relatively unchanged year on year (-0.5%).

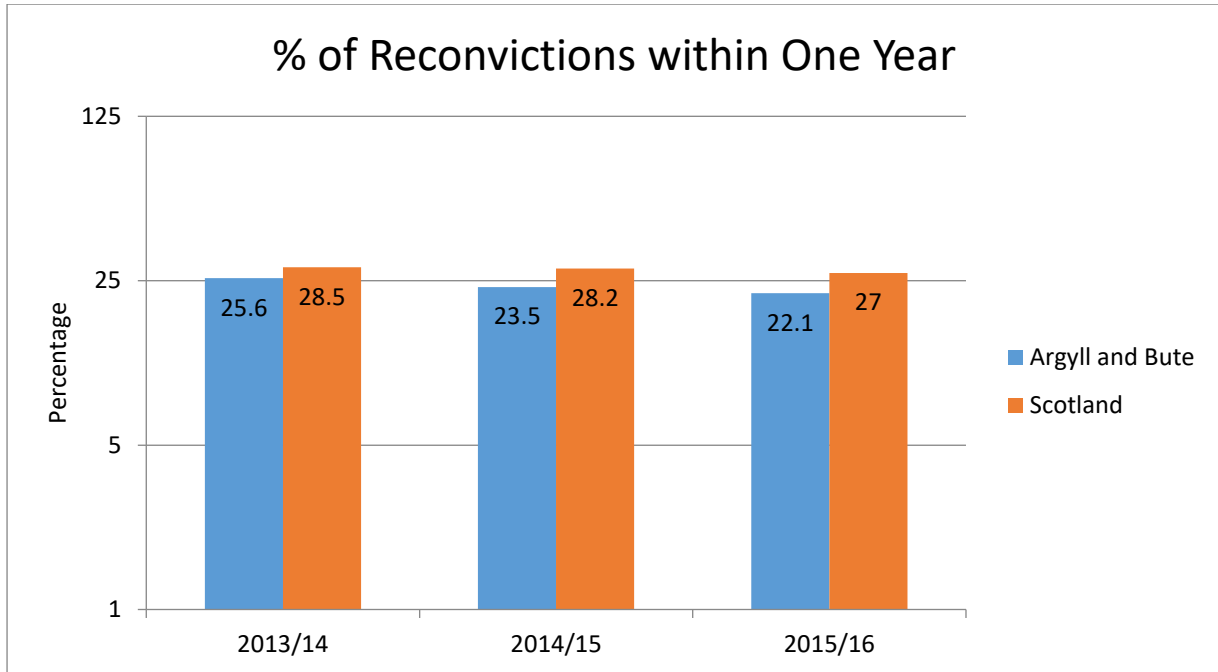


The number of crimes and offences recorded in Argyll and Bute per 10,000 population has continued to decline.

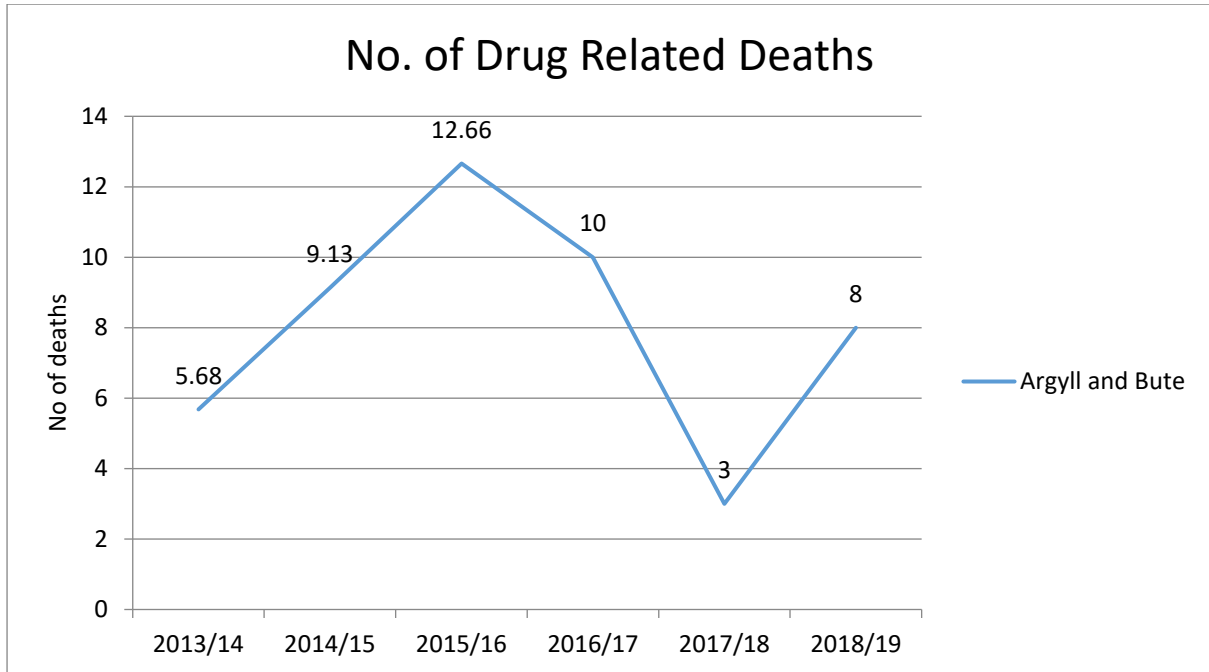
The percentage of reconvictions within one year has decreased to 22.1%. The definition of this indicator is the percentage of offenders with index convictions from a court in the cohort who were reconvicted one or more times by a court within a specified follow up period from the relevant date of the index conviction (one year).

The reconviction rate is also below the Scottish average.

Drug related deaths

Toxicology reports are confirmed for 4 of these deaths, with the other 4 awaited. In most cases the victim had consumed a variety of drug types including heroin, methadone and etizolam.
